> 3. Q: My son has been threatened with suspension. When can such an action be taken . . can I do anything?

A: A principal may suspend a pupil for any of the following reasons: (1) persistent truancy, (2) persistent opposition to authority, (3) use of profane or improper language, (4) wilful destruction of school property, (5) conduct injurious to physical or mental well-being of others in the school. The parent or guardian may appeal the suspension within seven days to the school board. If the appeal is successful, the suspension will be
