Nouvelles de Lafontaine

C'est en 1615 le 12 août que le R.P. Joseph LeCaron, missionnaire de la Société des Récollets, célébrait la messe dans le village huron de Carahagoua, la première messe à être célébrée au Canada à l'ouest de la ville de Québec. Sur ce site historique entretenu par les Chevaliers de Colomb, on commémorera cet événement le dimanche 14 août (en cas de température inclemente, le dimanche 21 août).

Cet événement, sous la tutelle de la paroisse de Lafontaine, sera bilingue. Un certain nombre d'automobiles partiront

de l'église de Lafontaine vers 1h.30 pour se rendre en procession au terrain de Carahagoua. On peut s'y rendre en prenant le chemin de Pointe-aux-Cèdres jusqu'à la 18e concession. On tourne alors à gauche. On fait encore un virage à gauche et l'on est à Carahagoua. Les indications au cours du chemin sont faciles à suivre.

A 2 h. p.m., la messe sera célébrée en français, avec lectures en anglais et en français. L'homélie, prononcée dans les deux langues, portera sur les martyrs canadiens.

La messe sera suivie de

musique et de danses indiennes par un groupe d'Indiens de l'île Beausoleil. Le chœur de chant de la paroisse Ste-Anne de Penetanguishene dirigé par André Boileau sera au programme. Il y aura des jeux organisés par le Comité du Parc et Récréation de Lafontaine pour les enfants petits et

grands. Pour terminer la journée, on chantera ensemble autour d'un feu de joie. Il y aura un casse-croûte et des toilettes d'aisances sur les lieux. Chacun est prié d'apporter sa nourriture et ses chaises et sa table de pique-nique s'il en desire. Stationnement facile sur le site.
