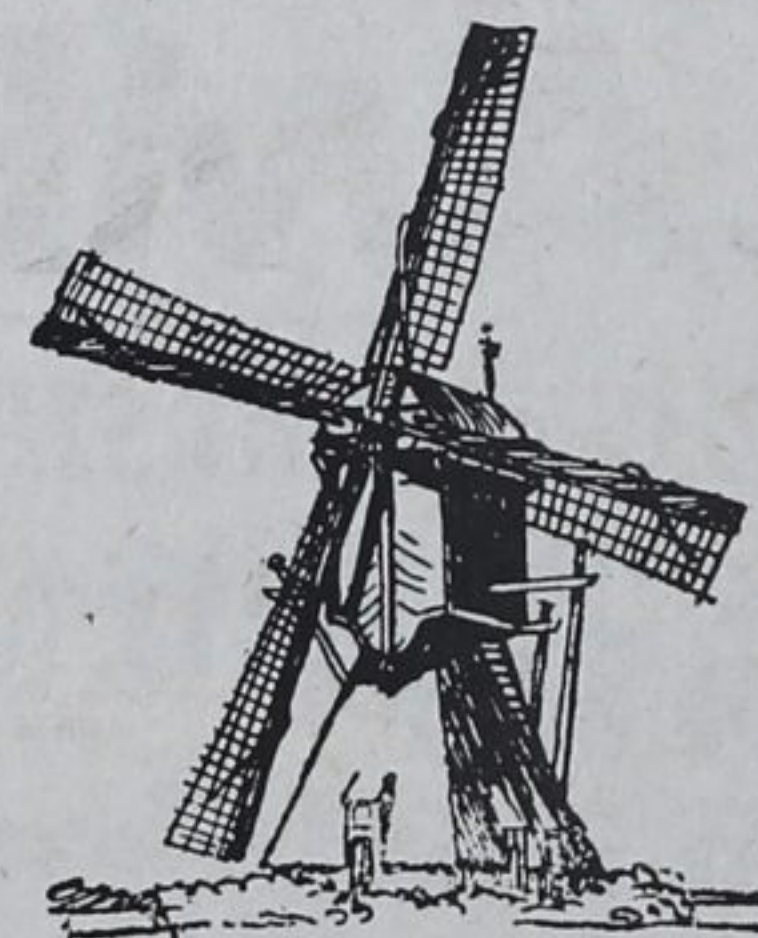

**Coldwater Fall Fair, Sept. 30**

Coldwater Fall Fair programs have been distributed to all students in Coldwater, Moonstone and Warminster Public Schools. These programs list 110 entries available to the school children. The director of the school fair, Mrs. Lorraine Orr, has been visiting the classrooms this week to explain the program to the students.

Volunteers have been contacted to help set up the displays on preparation night Thursday September 29 and to judge the entries on Friday morning September 30.

Three varieties of potatoes and kernels of Indian Corn in three colors, (donated by Elmer Gratrix, Fair President) were distributed to students in each of the participating schools. These students are required to plant and harvest the crops and enter them in the Fair. They are also required to complete a questionnaire regarding the method of planting and fertilizing.

All the students from the three schools will march in the parade to the music of two bands from Elmvalle Public School and Park Street Collegiate. The parade will begin at 1:00 p.m. Coldwater Public School travelling along Grey Street at Main Street to the Fairgrounds for the opening ceremonies.
