


2. THE FIRST NOEL

Over the hills and snow.


24. JINGLE BELLS



The holly bears a berry as red as any blood, And Mary bore sweet Jesus Christ, On Christmas Day in the morn.




21. GOOD KING WENCESLAS



21. GOOD KING WENCESLAS


Good King Wenceslas looked out, On the Feast of Stephen, When the snow lay round about, Deep and crisp, and even;


