Waubushene students attend legislature

For close to 20 grade 8 History students at Waubushene Public School, last month was an educational treat—if such a term exists.

The students travelled to Queen's Park to see a good friend of their in action: Terri Ann Butler from Waubushene Public School, who is a page in the Ontario Legislature.

But at the same time they had the occasion to run into a few other "friends." Among those were MPP for Simcoe East Gord Smith, Minister of Universities and Colleges Dr. Harry Parrott, New Democratic leader Stephen Lewis, and last, and certainly not

least, Ontario's Premier Bill Davis.

The contingent was led by Waubushene Public School teacher Bernie Wigglesworth and even employed the driving services of Terri Ann's mother to motor the students down to Queen's Park, and Midland resident and Waubushene teacher Paul Delaney.

The students study all levels of government in the grade 8 History classes and for many, the visit to Ontario's seat of government wasn't a first. The students at Waubushene have a regular entourage visit the provincial legislature to see how the province's

government does business first-hand.

Shortly after the students took their seats in the gallery Stephen Lewis rose and made the trek to the section of the gallery in which the students were located. He introduced himself and engaged in a brief conversation with the Waubushene visitors.

After the session of provincial parliament broke, the students were treated to a short talk and question period with former speaker of the Ontario legislature Russell Rowe.

Also during the day long trek to Toronto, the students got an inside look at the duties and

responsibilities of their fellow classmate Terri.

But to crown the visit—the students literally "bumped" into the Premier himself. When making a hasty exit out of the eastern doors of the legislative buildings who should they meet but William Davis. The Premier was enjoying a brief conversation with a couple of chauffeurs when

the Waubushene students flooded out of the doors.

The students were somewhat unprepared for the meeting, but while the conversation was brief—the students found it

exciting. There are some things, Waubushene students are apt to tell you, that

just can't be described in history books.

A trip to the House of Commons in Ottawa is already planned for the new year.
