Now that Contact has received a registration number it is the hope of the board that the community will support the operation of Contact by their donations, that can be deducted from their taxes.

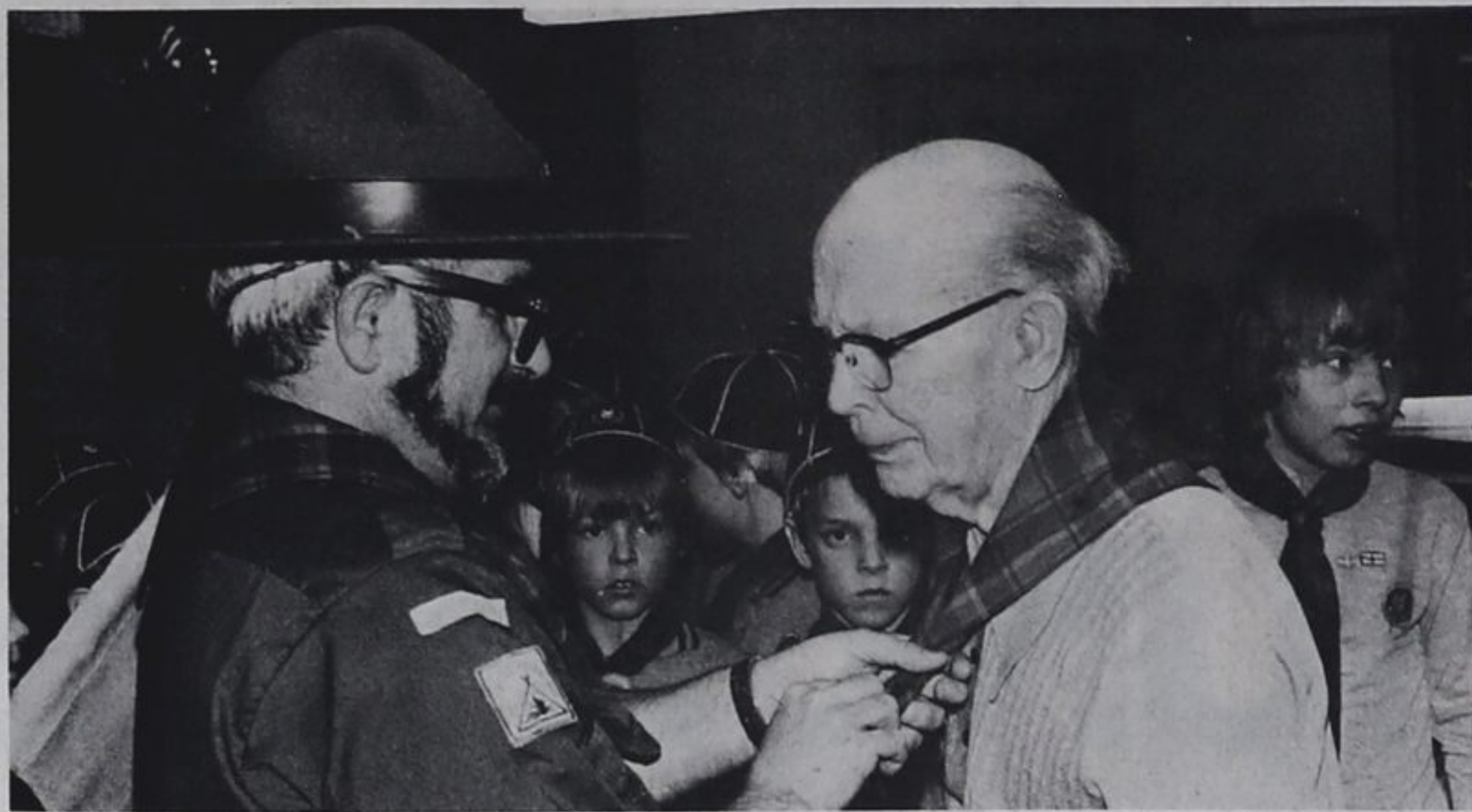

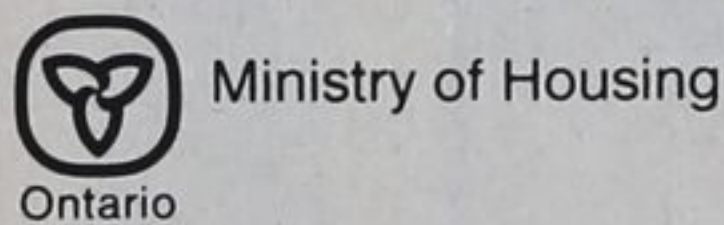
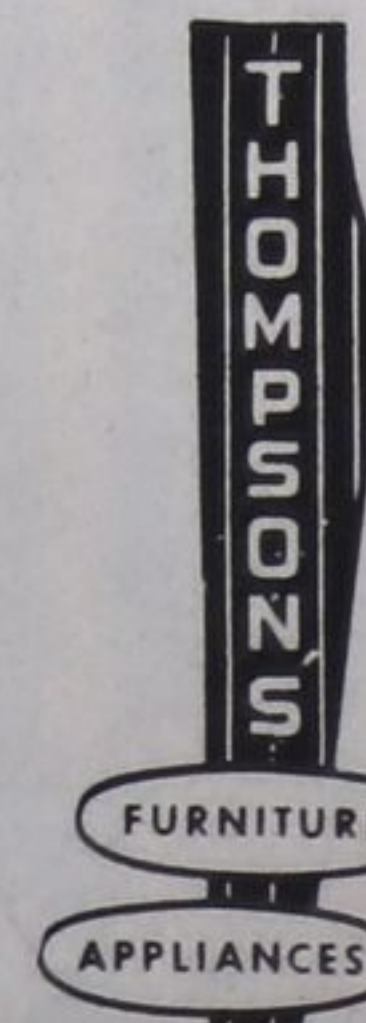
