It is necessary to improve basic skills in grammar not only in reading and writing but also to learn to speak properly as we live in a world of oral communications with radio and television becoming more important in our life style. There will be increased emphasis on French studies at the elementary levels. In Simcoe County schools at present French is not introduced until Grade 6

The improvements will be reflected in the future of our young people Students are better educated today than ever before. In 1940 only 10 per cent of all young people completed their education. In 1977 90 per cent of the students completed their schooling with only 10 per cent dropping out.

There are 43,500 students in Simcoe County and 50 per cent of these are being bused 22,000 miles per day.
