

Starts April 12

Festival adjudicators announced

The adjudicators for the annual Y's men's music festival, scheduled to begin on April 12, have been selected. They are: Eugene Laskiewicz, Charles Monreuil, Andrew Markov and Eldon Brethour.

Mr. Laskiewicz will be adjudicating the accordion competition, the first event in the two week festival.

Mr. Laskiewicz holds the distinction of being the first accordionist in Canada to be allowed candidacy for a Bachelor of Music degree, and holds the degree from Queen's University. Long associated with the Royal Conservatory of Music, Mr. Laskiewicz has represented Canada in various international accordion competitions, and has performed his art across Europe.

He has also performed in such notable accordion ensembles as the Stratford Ensemble and the Chamber Players of Toronto. He has also performed with members of the National Arts Centre Orchestra.

Mr. Laskiewicz is currently on staff at the Royal Conservatory of Music, Toronto, and Mohawk College in Hamilton.

Judging the instrumental section of the festival will be Charles Monreuil of Orillia.

Fifty-nine-year-old Mr. Monreuil has been connected with various groups during his career, including the Ursuline

Youth Orchestra, The Essex Scottish Regimental Band, and the Royal Conservatory of Music. In 1948 he began his secondary school music teaching career in Bancroft, and 10 years later moved to head the music department at Orillia District and Vocational Institute, and four years later moved to Park Street Collegiate to begin the instrumental music program there.

He has served as Bandmaster of the Orillia Kiltie Band, and has been musical director of the Mariposa Arts Theatre Orchestra.

Andrew Markov of the Royal Conservatory of Music will be adjudicating the piano competitions on April 17 and 18. A student of the respected Boris Berlin, Mr. Markov has received music degrees from the University of Toronto, and the Kiev Conservatory in the Soviet Union.

In 1971, Mr. Markov joined the Royal Conservatory, of which faculty association he is now president. He is a frequent adjudicator at music festivals and performs on a regular basis in a number of ensembles.

For the final three days of competition, Eldon Brethour, presently the conductor of the group "Singers Over Sixty", will be adjudicating the vocal and choral entries.

Mr. Brethour holds numerous distinctions to

his credit, including being the Director of Music for the Toronto Board of Education, the directorship of the Canadian Bureau for the Advancement of Music, and a

lifetime membership in the Toronto Musician's Association. Mr. Brethour has been an adjudicator at most Canadian Music Festivals.
