## Apply now for Canada Works grants

Applications for the 1978-79 Canada Works program are now available at Midland's Canada Manpower Centre on Dominion Avenue, it was announced

Monday. Canada Manpower Centre Manager Don McNee says that potential programs will have more opportunity to make up their submissions as this year's cut-off date for receiving the applications has been set at June 24.

Mr. McNee says the types of projects considered for funding would be those creating new jobs that would match the skills of the locally unemployed, create jobs that are over and above those that would normally exist in the community and create jobs that as designed to maintain or increase the skills of the project's employees.

Applications will be accepted from established organizations partnerships or corporations. Applications from newly formed groups or individuals will also be considered.

McNee indicated that the approved projects must start between September 1, 1978 and January 31, 1979. All projects must finish no later than January 31,

Pole, hedge, car worse for wear after accident

A telephone pole, a hedge, and a parked car are all a little worse for wear as the result of a Sunday morning accident on William Street at McCartney Street.

Police say that a car driven by Douglas Juneau of Juneau Street in Victoria Harbour was northbound on William Street, when it crossed over to the southbound lanes, entered driveway, and continued northbound for another 51 metres. In the process a telephone pole was cut

off, and a hedge uprooted. The car continued across McCartney Street and eventually hit a parked auto belonging to Madeleine Bray of William Street

Damage to the Juneau vehicle totalled \$350, and to the Bray auto, \$200. Damage to the telephone pole and the hedge could total \$250, police estimate.

A charge of careless driving has been laid as a result of the incident.

Plants are subject of Library seminar
