Quilty, Weissflog champs

Weissflog teamed with Crawley to win the boys' doubles event beating Chris Cote and Lee Crowe and went on to capture his third trophy when he combined with Quilty, to win the mixed doubles title from Patti Cox and Crawley. Jenny Weissflog and Cindy Leclair narrowly

defeated Susan Lamers and Patti Cox in the girls' doubles final. Chris Weissflog dropped the first game of the boys' singles final against Crawley 7-15, but came back to win two straight by scores of 15-7 and 15-10. Register beef cattle by May 31

Beef calf producers will have an opportunity to register their beef cows on Ontario's 1978 Plan no later than May 31, 1978. The count is to be taken effective April 1st and is to include cows that have calved or are bred to calve in 1978. The enrolment fee is \$8.00 per cow and this fee is to be sent with your registration form. The cheque is to be made payable to the Treasurer of Ontario. The support price for stocker calves is set at 51.5 cents per pound based on a 450 lb. calf and an 85 per cent calf crop. In other words, for each 10 cents that the market price falls below 51.5 cents you will receive \$38.25 per eligible cow. New participants are asked to pick up their enrolment forms at the Elmvalle Agricultural Office. Private Treaty Sale A private treaty sale of station tested beef bulls will be held on May 12, 1978 at the Arkell Research Farm south of Guelph. The sale starts at 1:00 p.m. and will feature 90 high performance bulls. Gains are provided for the first 112 days on test. There are thirteen breeds on test at Arkell, over 35 per cent of the bulls are Hereford. Workman's Compensation Workman's Compensation is compulsory for all farm workers both full time and part-time. The rate, effective January 1, 1978 for livestock, general, and cash crop farms is \$3.40 per \$100 of payroll. The employer is required to file payroll returns for each workman to the District Office of the Workmen's Compensation Board, 2 Bloor Street East, Toronto. A farmer now has the option of electing coverage for himself. His assessment will be at a rate applicable to the major portion of his payroll. He may elect a reasonable wage between \$6,240 and \$15,000 per year.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD BY THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF ELMVALE FOR APPROVAL OF A BY-LAW TO REGULATE LAND USE PASSED PURSUANT TO SECTION 35 OF THE PLANNING ACT (R.S.O. 1970)

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Elmvalle intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board, pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the Planning Act (R.S.O. 1970), for approval of By-law No. 78-B... passed on the 24th day of April, 1978. A copy of the by-law is furnished herewith. A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished herewith.

ANY PERSON INTERESTED MAY, within twenty-one (21) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Village of Elmvalle, notice of objection to approval of the said by-law or any part thereof and shall indicate that, if a hearing is held, the objector or an agent will attend at the hearing to state the objection.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the said by-law may, within twenty-one (21) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Village of Elmvalle, notice of his support of approval of the said by-law, together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held, giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law, but before doing so, it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the said by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with, or delivered to, the Clerk undersigned the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent.

THE LAST DATE FOR FILING OBJECTIONS will be the 24th day of MAY, 1978.

THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF ELMVALE
EXPLANATORY NOTE TO BY-LAW NO. 78-B.

The following is an explanatory note to By-law No. 78-B, which amends By-law No. 74-14, as amended (the Comprehensive Zoning By-law for the Village of Elmvalle):

The Village of Elmvalle has received an application requesting that the lands in part of lot 6, Concession IX be zoned to permit the development of a senior citizens' apartment by the Ontario Housing Corporation.

This By-law creates a Special Residential 3 Zone for the subject lands. Schedule "A" to this By-law changes the zone symbol on the said lands from R1 to R3-2.

This By-law becomes effective when passed by Council subject to its approval by the Ontario Municipal Board.

THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF ELMVALE
BY-LAW NO. 78-B.
A BY-LAW TO AMEND ZONING BY-LAW NO. 74-14

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Elmvalle deems it advisable to amend By-law No. 74-14, as amended;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Elmvalle ENACTS as follows:

1. Section 9 of By-law No. 74-14 is hereby amended by the addition of the following at the end thereof:

"(5) SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL TYPE 3 ZONE (R3-2)

Notwithstanding any provisions of Section 9(1) hereof to the contrary, on any lands designated R3-2 on Schedule "A" hereto, no person shall use any land or erect, alter or use any building or structure for any purpose except one or more of the following special uses, namely:

(a) RESIDENTIAL USES:
a senior citizens' apartment.

(b) NON-RESIDENTIAL USES:
a public use.

(6) SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR R3-2 ZONES

Notwithstanding any provisions of Section 9(2) hereof to the contrary, no person shall, on any lands designated R3-2 on Schedule "A" hereto, use any land or erect, alter or use any building or structure except in accordance with the following special provisions:

(a) LOT AREA (minimum): - 23,000 square feet
(b) LOT FRONTAGE (minimum): - 105 feet
(c) FRONT YARD DEPTH (minimum): - 11 feet
(d) INTERIOR SIDE YARD WIDTH (minimum): - 25 feet
(e) REAR YARD DEPTH (minimum): - 10 feet
(f) LANDSCAPED OPEN SPACE (minimum): - 35%
(g) LOT COVERAGE (maximum): - 30%
(h) DWELLING HOUSES PER LOT (maximum): - 1 only
(i) ACCESSORY USES, PARKING, ETC.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 5 hereof."

2. Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of By-law No. 74-14 is hereby amended by changing to R3-2 the zone symbol of the lands designated "ZONE CHANGE TO R3-2" on the attached Schedule "A" hereto.

3. This By-law shall become effective on the date hereof, subject to receiving the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.
