

# Summer's here - OPP plagued by accidents

For Midland OPP, there's one sure sign that summer is on its way - accidents in the Georgian Bay area start to increase sharply.

Last weekend, the OPP had its first taste of summer, as officers were called to investigate no less than nine major motor vehicle accidents.

**Parked Car**  
Police were called to Waubausene Saturday to investigate an accident

at the intersection of Birch and Amanda Streets, involving two cars.

Police say that a car driven by Cecile Gouette, Tay Township, was eastbound on Amanda Street when it crossed through the intersection of Birch Street onto a north shoulder where it struck a parked vehicle owned by Arthur Hamilton, Waubausene.

Damage to the Gouette

vehicle is set at \$600, and damage estimates on the Hamilton car total \$300. Gouette has been charged with a seatbelt infraction.

**Fail to Yield**  
Constable Hicks investigated an accident Friday around midnight that resulted in the laying of a fail to yield charge against an RRI, Perkinsfield man.

Police say that the

accident occurred on Highway 27, 2.2 km north of Highway 12, and involved cars driven by Robert O'Hara of Midland, and the man charged, Michael Desroches.

Apparently Desroches was exiting a private driveway when the mishap occurred.

The O'Hara vehicle sustained \$400 damage, and the Desroches car \$150 damage.

There were no injuries.

**Several Charges**  
A slate of charges faces a 19 year old Rexdale man following an accident which occurred early Saturday morning on Highway 12, just west of Highway 69.

According to police, a car driven by Herbert Hoover was west-bound on Highway 12 when it lost control, went into a ditch, and rolled over.

Both Hoover and a passenger, Calvin Evener, also of Rexdale, received minor injuries in the crash.

Hoover was subsequently charged with impaired driving, excess alcohol, having open liquor in a car, and driving without a driver's license.

His car sustained \$700 damage.

**Hit and Run**  
Police are still investigating a suspected hit and run which occurred Saturday at the junction of Highway 12 and Highway 69.

They say that a car driven by Dick Nuis was northbound on Highway 12 when an unknown car passed it on the right, lost control and swerved

it. Damage to the Nuis car totalled \$450.

**Two Car Mishap**  
Cars driven by William King of Midland, and Wayne Standon, also of Midland were involved in

a mishap which occurred early Sunday morning in Port McNicoll.

Police say that the King vehicle was northbound on Second Avenue, proceed through the intersection at Second St.

when it collided with the Standon vehicle.

The King car received \$200 damage, and the Standon vehicle sustained \$450 damage.

No charges were laid.

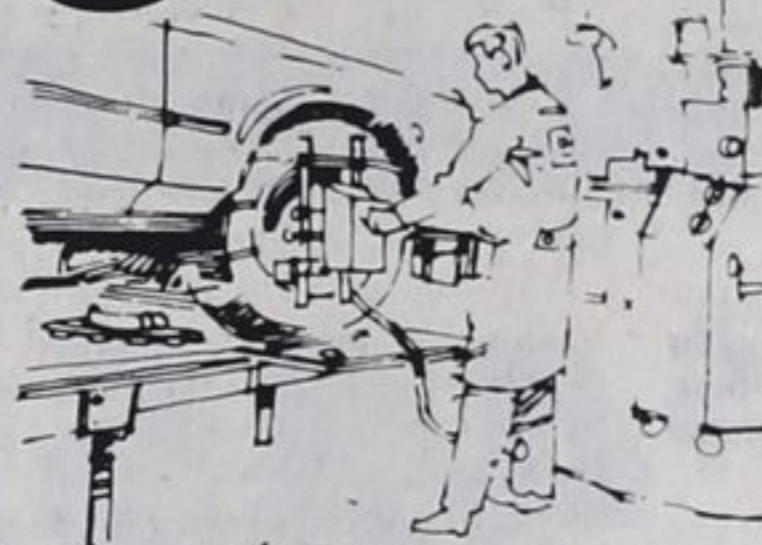

## Fesserton house fire leaves family homeless

The Gary Tims family of Fesserton narrowly escaped injury late Sunday night as fire tore quickly through the upstairs bedroom area of their Fesserton Sideroad home.

Tay Township fire officials have determined the cause of the blaze to be careless smoking, and have set damage estimates at upwards of \$10,000.

They say the fire started in a bedroom, and spread rapidly through

the upstairs area of the home. At its peak, flames could be seen shooting from upper storey windows, and the fire threatened to consume the entire two storey frame house.

There was some fear initially that a 15-year-old boy had been trapped inside the burning building, but three searches of the upstairs area revealed no one inside.

The boy was later discovered outside the

building unharmed.

Tay fire chief Tom O'Hara said after the blaze that firemen first received notice of the blaze at 10:35 p.m. A tanker and pumper from Waubausene arrived on the scene about five minutes after the call was received.

A short time later, when it seemed the fire would spread further, a 2,000 gallon tanker from Tav's Old Fort Road station was called in, but by the time it arrived, firemen had the blaze under control.

Firemen were on the scene until about 2 a.m. mopping up water damage and extinguishing sparks which had become trapped between walls.

The Tims have four children ranging in age from eight to 16 years, and the family has moved in temporarily with friends.

## Vandals strike

### Stollar subdivision

Vandals have struck Midland once again, this time in the Twin Pine Estates subdivision, on Glen Bogie Crescent.

Midland police report that a watchman for Stollar Construction, the

subdivision builders, informed the department Sunday morning that rocks had been thrown through 13 windows in newly constructed homes.

The total damage is estimated to be \$200.

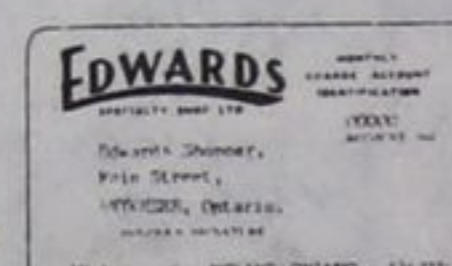
