

Jackson's 72 wins Early Bird tournament

Defense, face offs

New regulations slated for 1978 lacrosse season

Midland lacrosse players will have a couple of new wrinkles in their game for the 1978 season, following the Ontario Minor Lacrosse Association decision to adopt a new face off style and allow a zone defence. Rick Dorion, referee-in-chief for Midland said the faceoff style will now be to drop the ball from approximately six inches above the players sticks instead of placing it on the floor. The league will now allow a zone defence similar to the "box" in hockey. Dorion said the

change would permit a wider range of team tactics. Also new for this year is the waiving of the 30 second rule, while a team is playing short-handed. Normally the rules require that the team in possession of the ball make a shot on the opposing goal within 30 seconds. Dorion said the change in faceoff style was made to standardize league play with the other nine provinces; Ontario being the last to adopt the drop ball start.

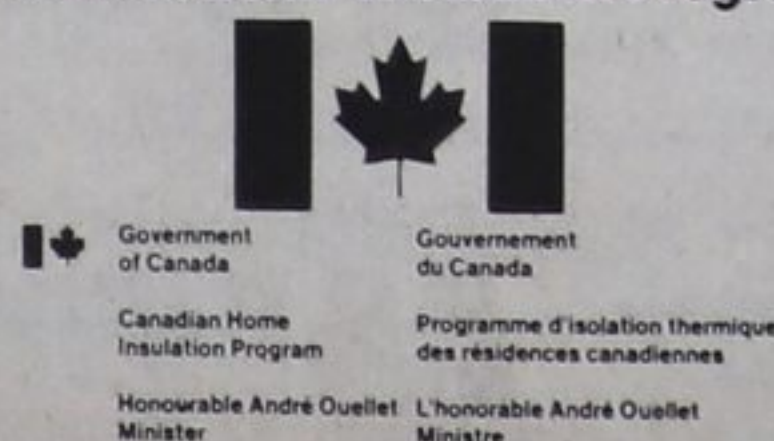

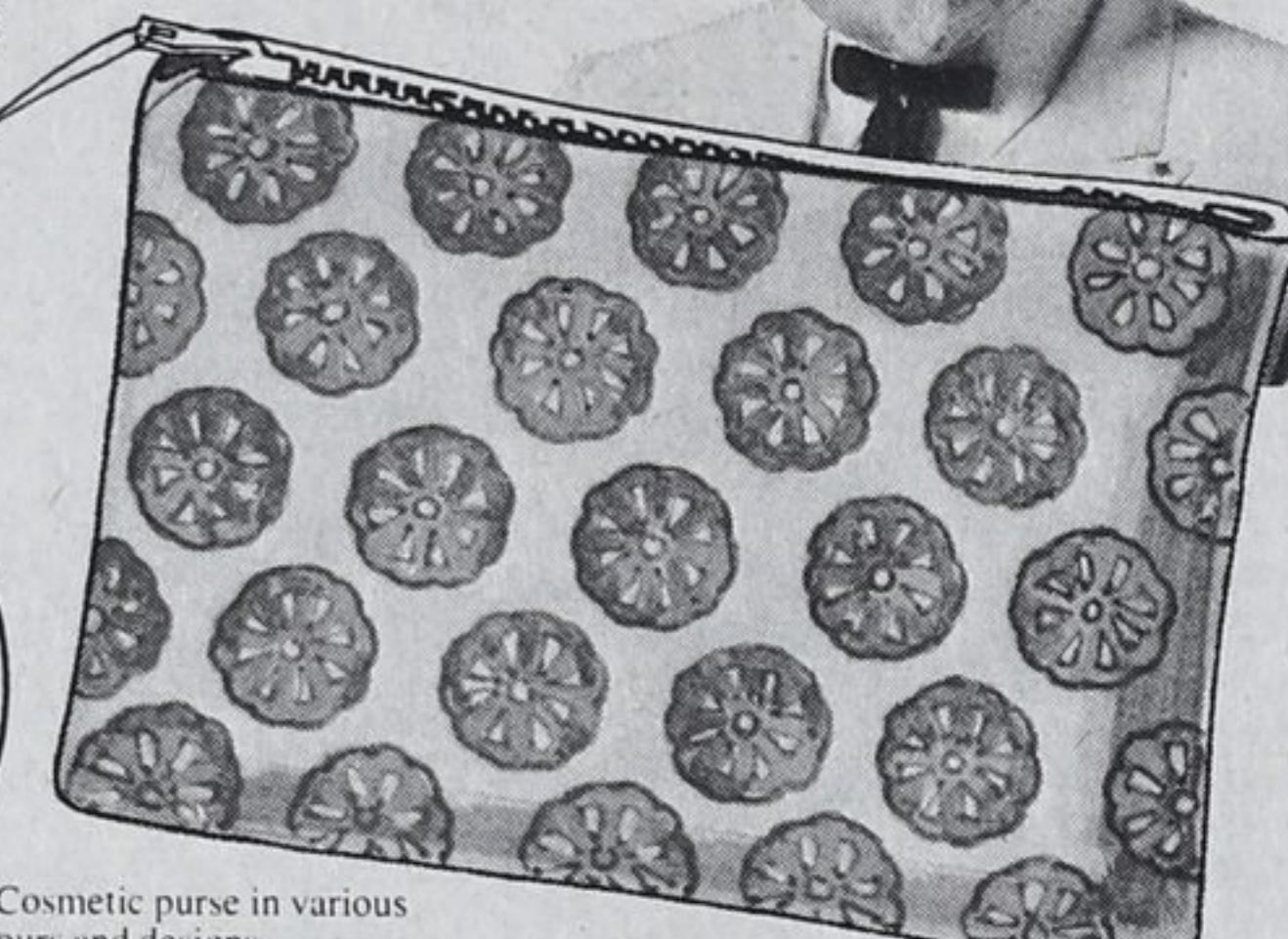

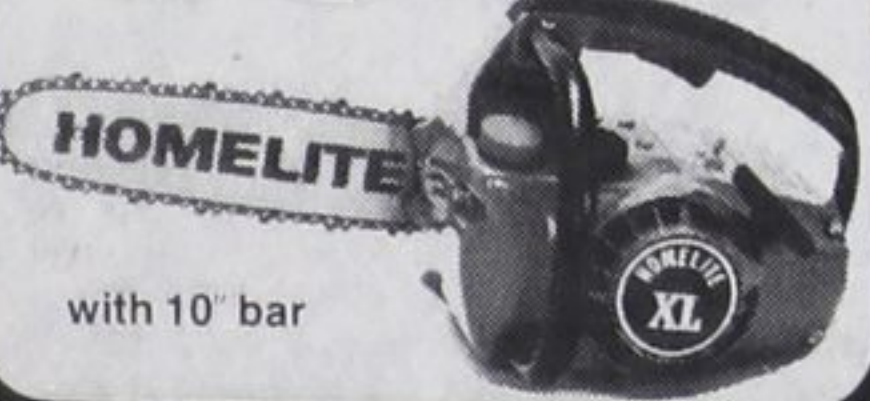
