All-star ball shifting to Tiffen Park

All-star baseball is leaving Little Lake Diamond. When the first ball is thrown out sometime in May, it will be at Tiffen Park on William Street.

Due to the construction of the new arena, the old diamond located behind the Midland Curling Club can only be used for softball necessitating the switch to Tiffen Park.

Doug Fox, chairman of the Board of Parks Management, said although the executive of the Midland Minor Baseball Association preferred the central location of Little Lake Park, they realized the need to move.

"They're disappointed with the move, naturally, it was a nice park. But, they've accepted it with good grace."

To prepare the new diamond for use by hardball teams, Fox said

the parks board will move the old backstop to the William Street location and install some snow fencing along the sidelines in time for May 26 home season opening.

The four Midland all-star teams playing in the York-Simcoe Baseball Association this season will play the first few games of their schedule out of town until the alterations are completed.

Fox said the first step will be to erect the backstop, and then if warranted, floodlights would be installed, possibly next year.

The Parks board will also install a new softball backstop at the old diamond for use by house league and recreational teams. The length of the

field is now shorter, because of the new arena, making it impractical for hardball.

The total cost of the improvements is expected to be approximately \$12,000, most of which would be spent on moving the floodlights around at Little Lake Diamond for the softball

field. Fox said there had been requests by some baseball officials to move the diamond to make it suitable, again for hardball, but, the arrangements would have to go through town council and would mean a delay of almost a year.

Moving to Little Lake Diamond, he said, would

involve blocking off Fredrick Street which continues through the edge of the park and is considered a fire-service

road. Approval for such a move would have to come from council.

The other reason moving the diamond was

ruled out, according to Fox, is that if the arena is expanded to two ice surfaces, the diamond would disappear anyway.

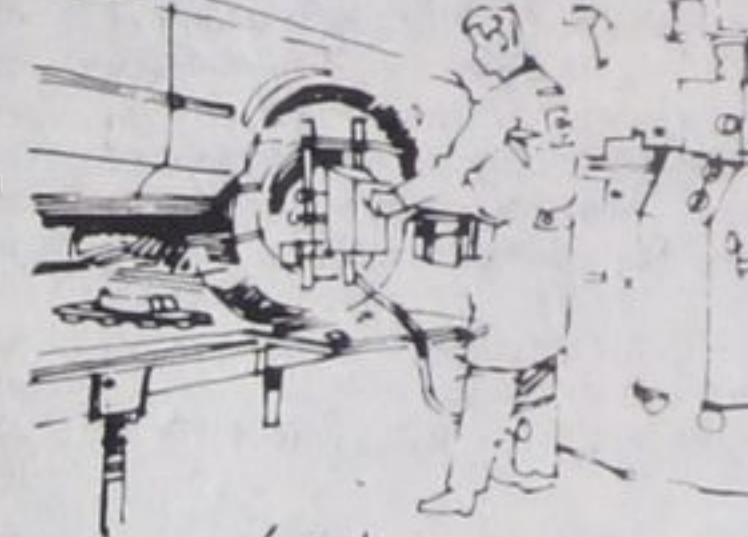
