Clarke, Moyer hit provincial track top ten

Todd Clarke and Jan Moyer of Midland Secondary School rank among the top ten athletes in the province in their events after finishing ninth in the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association Track and Field finals at Queen's University Saturday.

Clarke threw the discus 44 metres in the Midgets boys division to gain his top ten placing. Moyer hurled the javelin 30.52 metres in the midget girls division to also finish ninth.

Both athletes performed up to their abilities according to MSS coach Doug Andrews and their throws were just short of qualifying them for further competition among the top eight places.

Clarke's previous best throw is 45 metres while Moyer's best to date is 32 metres.

Ernie Desroches, also an MSS student, ran to a

ninth place finish in a preliminary heat for the junior boys' 1500 metre, with a time 4:14. In the final he lead for the first three laps, but fell to 14th place overall when the pack passed him in the third lap.

Paul Duval of St. Theresa's High School, qualified for the provincial meet with a jump of 1.72 m but could only clear 1.65m putting him in 16th place overall.

Rick Presse, coach of the St. Theresa's track team said Duval had been put off his best when he had to hurry his warm up for the competition early Friday morning.

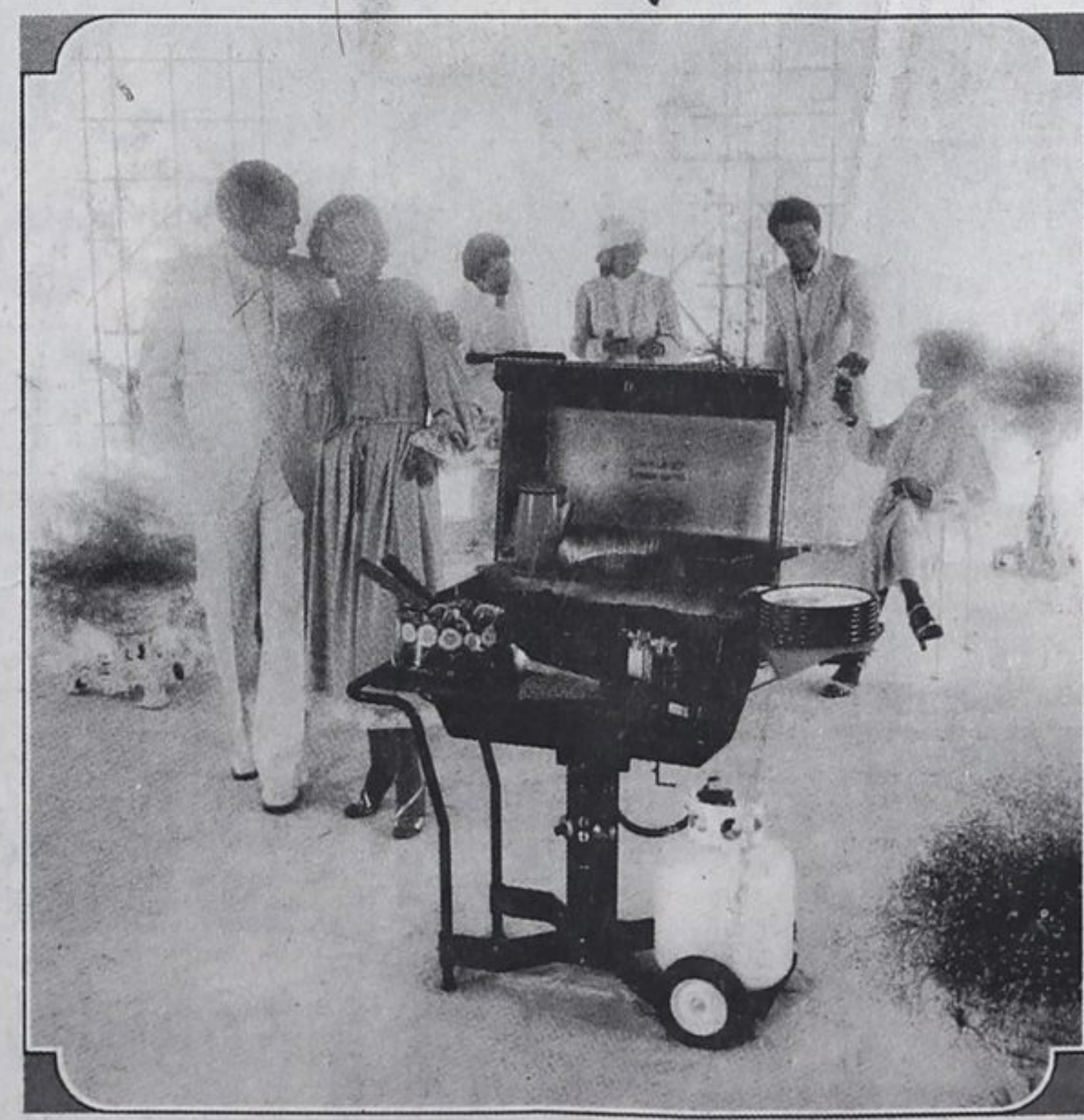
