Village says yes to liquor

Residents in the village of Elmvalle voted in favour of serving liquor in licensed dining rooms, licensed lounges and licensed entertainment lounges within the village limits on Monday.

From the time the polls opened at 11:00 a.m. until 4:30 in the afternoon, the turnout was very light with only 200 of the 944 eligible voters casting their ballots. This left another 230 voters rushing to make their mark on the ballots in the remaining three and a half hours before the polls closed.

Workers for the vote yes committee, headed by Palace Hotel owner Pete Steele, began calling residents at 5:30 p.m. to remind them to vote. They discovered through their efforts, many people had forgotten about the plebiscite.

At least 60 per cent of the ballots had to be in favour of the liquor vote for it to pass and with 80 per cent of the voters indicating a "yes" on Monday's ballots, the local restaurants and hotel can now apply for a license to serve spirits to their customers.
