

Report is ordered in assault case

A pre-sentence report was ordered in the case of a Midland youth who pleaded guilty to assault causing bodily harm in Provincial Court on Monday morning.

Paul McClung who was charged on May 14, apparently got into an argument with the driver of a truck which pulled into his driveway. A fist fight started and the truck driver's face was struck by Mr. McClung's foot. Tom Cleary, the crown prosecutor told the judge the driver was kept in the hospital overnight because his eye was

severely swollen. A statement written by Paul McClung which was not read to the court indicated why the fight began.

Paul McClung's lawyer asked the matter be remanded until he had time to gather some information on the boy. Judge Norman Nadeau agreed and ordered a pre-sentence report.

Michael McClung, the accused's brother who was also charged in the case had the charged against him withdrawn at the request of Mr. Cleary.

Found guilty of jacket theft

A Toronto man was fined \$150 in Provincial Court on Monday morning after pleading guilty to being in possession of a stolen jacket. Ronald Prue was charged with possession of stolen goods last week. According to the crown brief a nylon

jacket was stolen from a parked car in Midland. A short time later Mr. Prue was seen wearing the jacket by the jacket owner two blocks away from where the car was parked. The person asked for it back, but Mr. Prue

refused. The police were summoned. The jacket was found in a garbage can near the place where it was last seen. Mr. Prue was picked up and questioned a short time later.

Judge Nadeau asked

Mr. Prue if he had any explanation for his actions. Mr. Prue shook his head.

"I am satisfied it warrants a conviction," Judge Nadeau said. Mr. Prue was given 60 days to pay.
