Highway study

Council endorses committee 'principles'

Midland Council endorsed the Highway 27 Steering Committee's report "Agreement on Planning Principles" on Monday despite objections from Deputy-Reeve Bill Ogilvie. The purpose of the report is to get municipal approval of the work done so far by the committee.

Along with Midland council, Tiny and Tay Townships will have to pass the document along with Penetanguishene council. Once endorsed,

the report will be used for further technical work and preparation of a proposed Secondary plan.

Deputy-Reeve Ogilvie said he had serious reservations about the agreement and called it "hypocritical." He said that one Tiny councillor called it "a shelter for Midland downtown businesses."

"Planners can come up with any document you are willing to pay for," he said. Alderman Platt who represents Midland on the

Highway 27 Steering Committee said the principles had been endorsed unanimously and were a plan for the foreseeable future.

The motion to endorse the report was passed with only the deputy-reeve opposed.

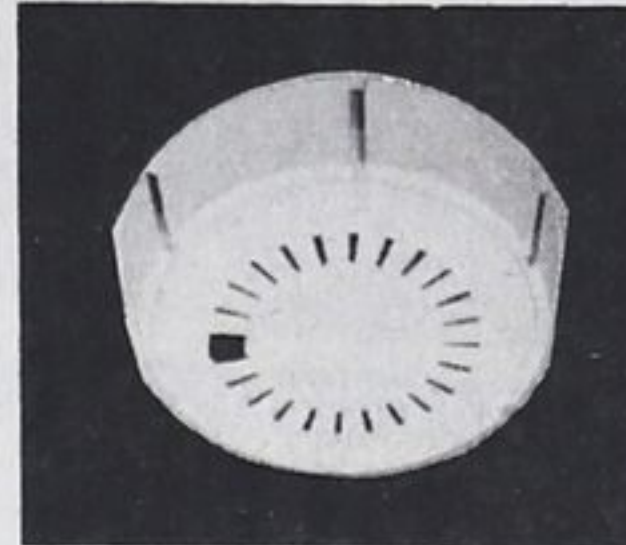

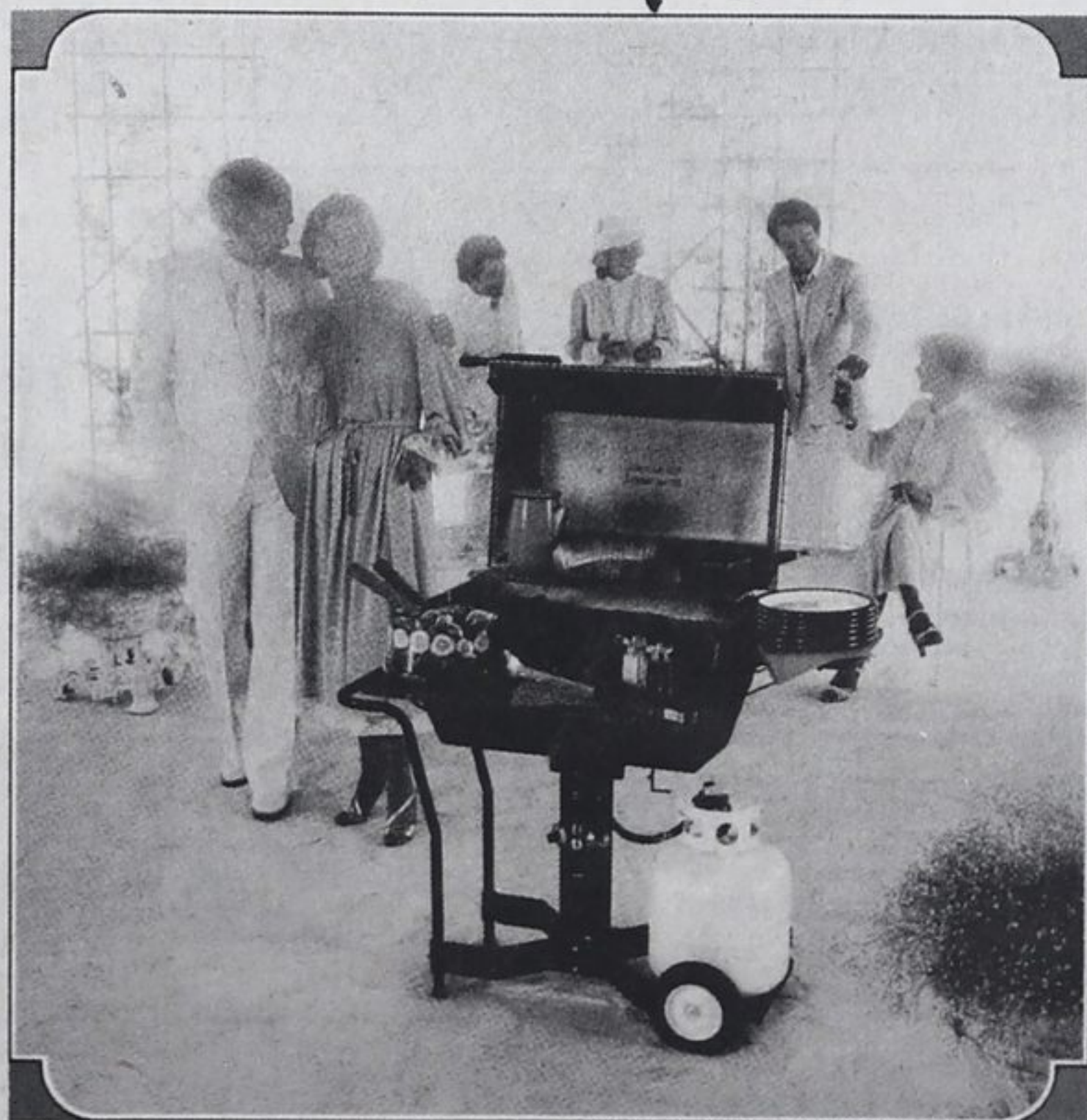

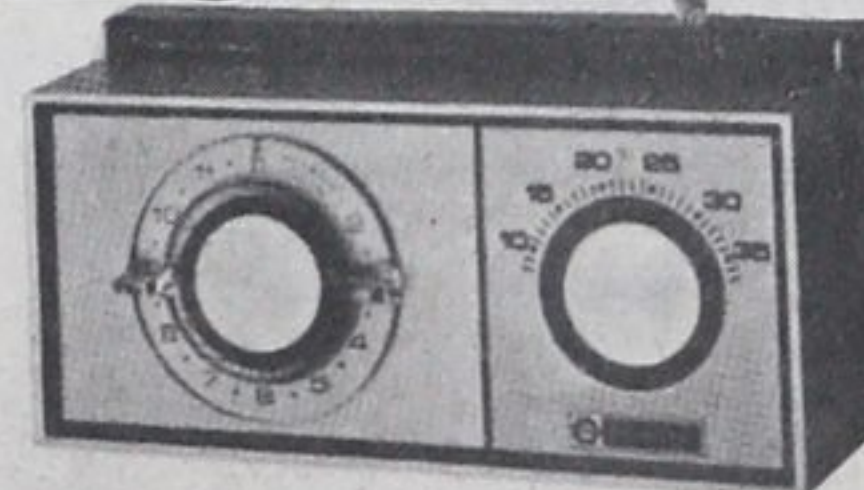
