Tiny Council hears request for water system hook up

Tiny Township Council heard a request at their last meeting, representatives who required council's permission to hook up into an existing water system, obtaining new water from this source until the new pumping station is completed for the subdivisions of Stocco and Belvedere. Council instructed water works superintendent, Hubert Charlebois and engineer Ron Robinson to look into this matter and to come up with a recommendation for council at the next meeting, scheduled for July 13. Maur-Lac Limited gave two reasons for the request of an interim water supply; that the water mains would be installed in a shorter time span than the pumping station could be built, necessitating a water source for the pressure testing of new mains before backfilling and suggesting that the availability of water would allow their clients to obtain building permits. This would facilitate the sale of lots and allow completion of services.
