S. PORTRAIT OF A SPY. Adams. RCMP Intelligence—the inside story, in the form of a novel, by Canadian writer Ian Adams.

WHISTLE. Jones. This is the third novel in James Jones' trilogy of World War II, begun with "From here to Eternity" and continued with "The Thin Red Line". Whistle tells the story of four men from the same infantry company, veterans of combat in the South Pacific, and among the first large waves of wounded sent home.

MAKE A WISH. Robertson. The compassionate, comic and convincing tale of a Midwestern news commentator and the most tragic news story of his career, by Don Robertson.

AIRSCREAM. Bruce. A mid-air collision between a

large passenger jet and a private plane, is the basic plot of this novel, by a new writer from New Zealand, John Bruce. Legal tangles, political intrigue, and a shattering climax make the aftermath of the disaster as exciting as the event itself.
