Fiction S. PORTRAIT OF A SPY. Adams. RCMP Intelligence—the inside story, in the form of a novel, by Canadian writer Ian Adams.

WHISTLE. Jones. This is the third novel in James Jones' trilogy of World War II, begun with "From here to Eternity" and continued with "The Thin Red Line". Whistle tells the story of four men from the same infantry company, veterans of combat in the South Pacific, and among the first large waves of wounded sent home.

MAKE A WISH. Robertson. The compassionate, comic and convincing tale of a Midwestern news commentator and the most tragic news story of his career, by Don Robertson.

AIRSCREAM. Bruce. A mid-air collision between a

#### Fined \$300 for **UIC** fraud

Mr. Mullen's lawyer told the court his client is married and has two children. He has been gainfully employed with the Coast Guard for several months.






