

Times reporter takes over Citizen

Andrew F. Markle, publisher of The Midland Times and The Penetanguishene Citizen, announced this week that Times reporter Terri Howell has been appointed to replace Howard Elliott as editor of The Citizen effective Monday, August 7.

Mr. Elliott, who holds a diploma in journalism from Conestoga College of Applied Arts and Technology, will be returning to the Kitchener-Waterloo area to either accept a reporting or public relations position.

He has been with The Citizen since January of this year.

Ms. Howell moves to take the reins of the Citizen after spending 11 months at The Times. As senior reporter on staff at The Times, Ms. Howell's major responsibility was coverage of Midland Town Council.

She holds a B.J. in journalism from Carleton University in Ottawa.

Both The Times and The Citizen are owned and operated by Markle Community Newspapers Limited.

Recreation
The Village of Victoria Harbour will be included in the Northern Municipalities Recreation Facilities Study. A grant has been provided to cover 50 per cent of the study. The study will include an inventory of existing facilities, including those being presently planned, and a report on the current physical conditions of major facilities. The study will also forecast future recreational needs.

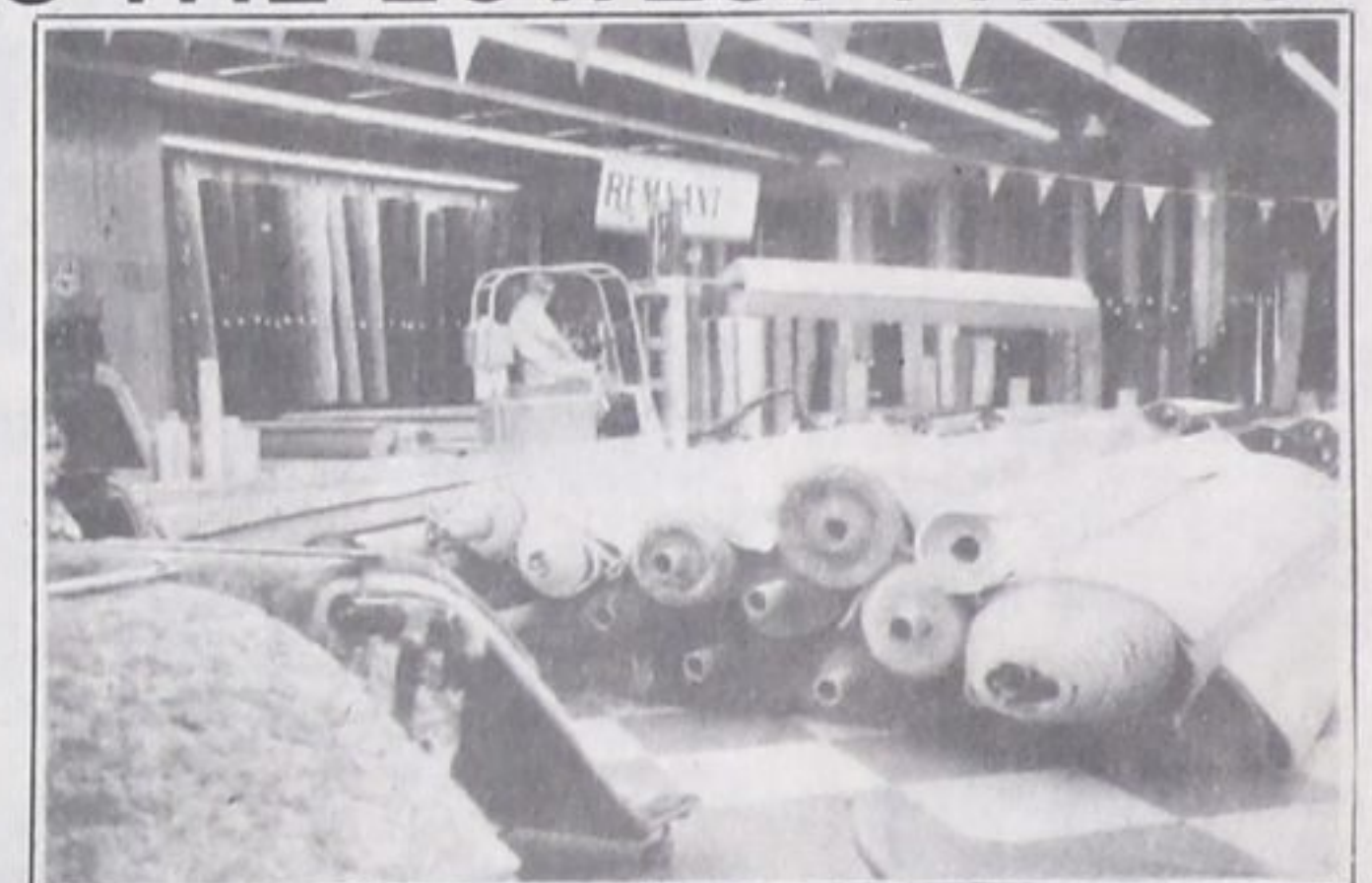
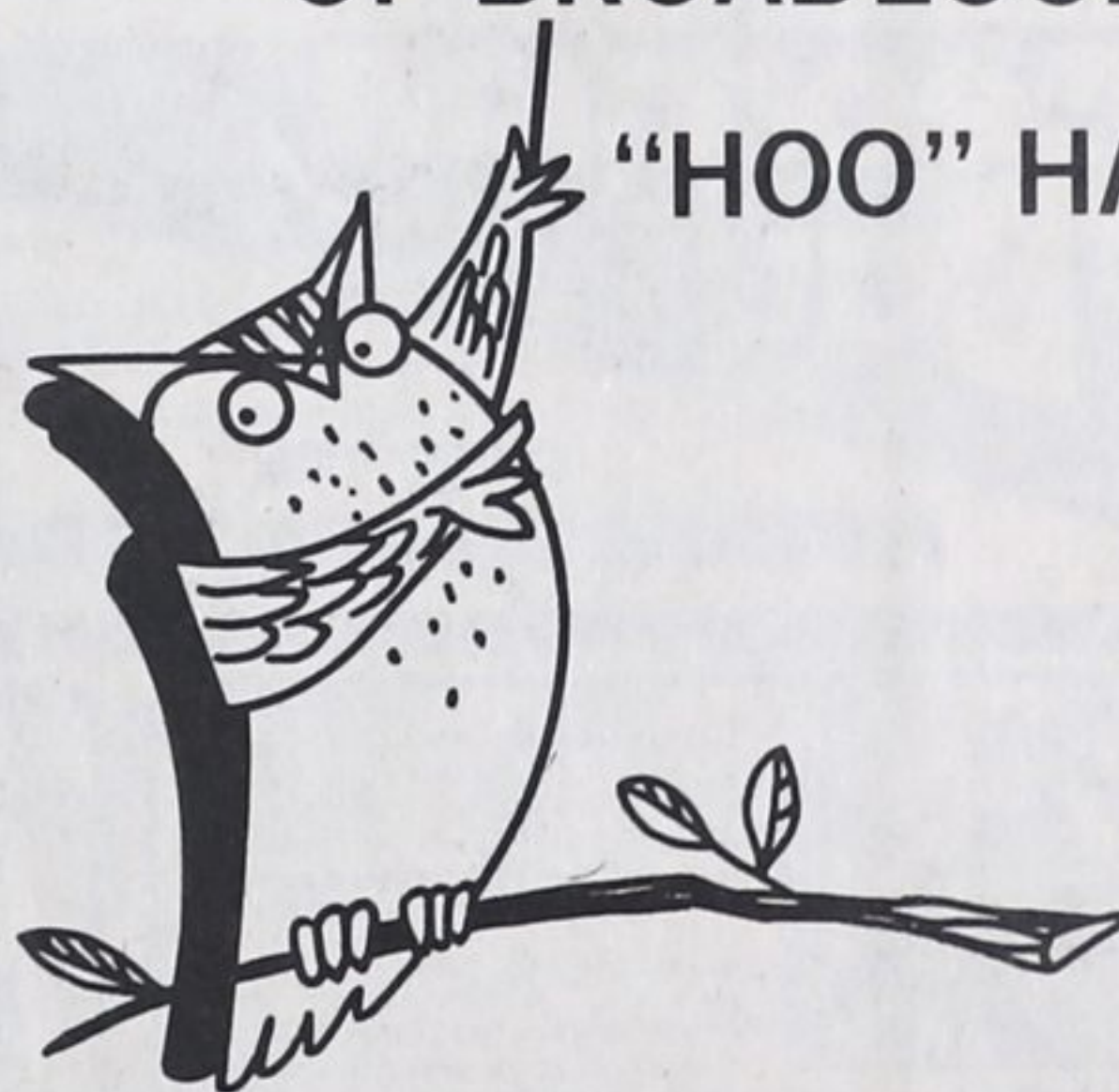
