the new Gray Coach terminal.) Council is arranging a meeting between the two companies in an effort to resolve the situation.

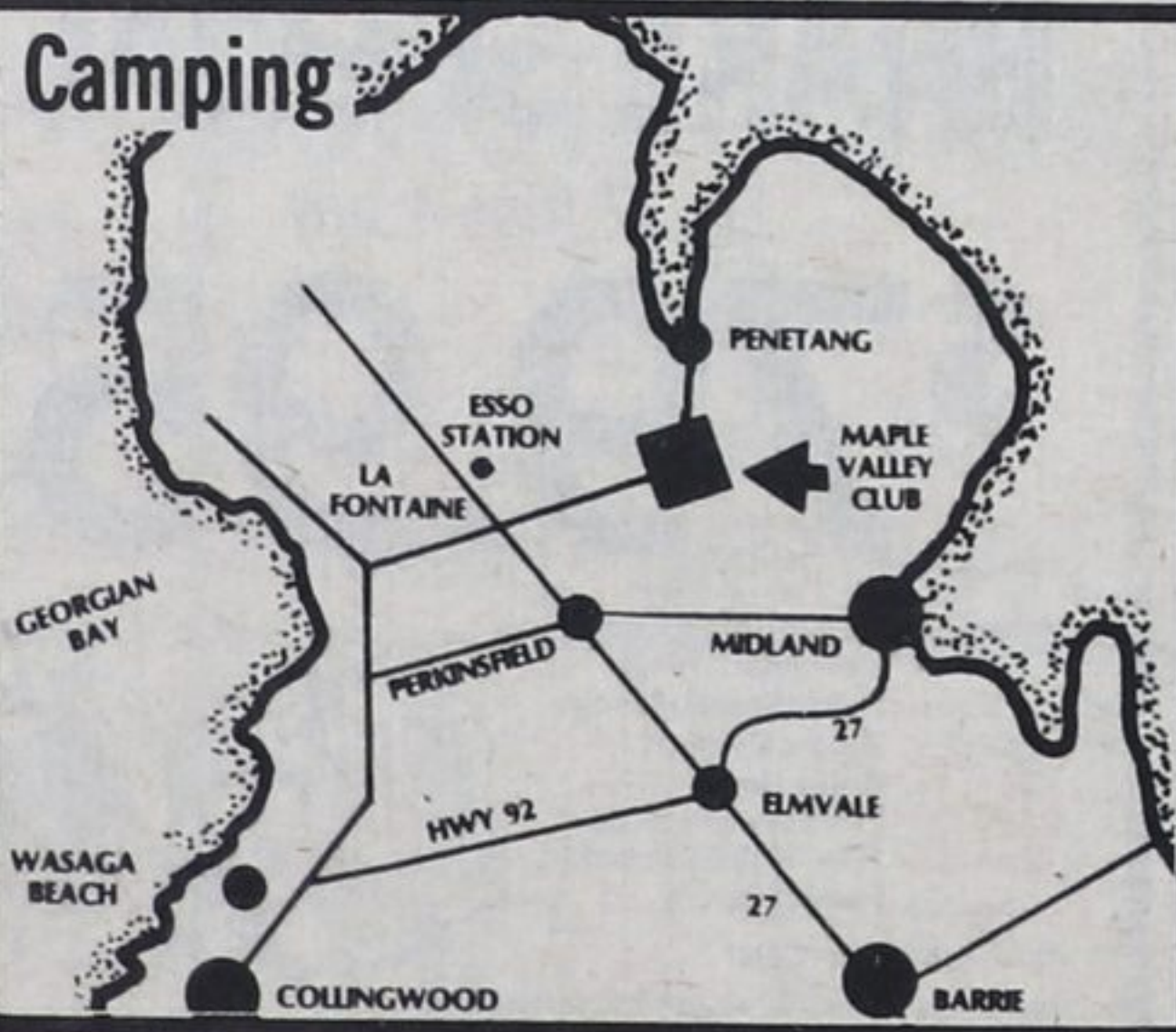

## Police chase theft suspects

Haliburton's Service Centre in Hillsdale was the starting point for a chase which led Elmvale OPP on a tour of Hillsdale, then Barrie and then to an area north of Elmvale, early last Sunday morning.

Police say a 12-volt battery was stolen from the back of a pick-up truck owned by Mount St. Louis Ski Resort and driven by Joseph Hunter, while at the station last weekend.

Police arrived in time to chase the suspects by car from Hillsdale to Barrie and on to the village where they were stopped just north of here. The battery was recovered and two Midland men were charged with theft under \$200 as a result of the incident.

Charged are Robin John Parker aged 21, of Midland and Michael Proulx, aged 19 of Midland. The pair are scheduled to appear in Provincial Court on June 30.
