Grain grading sorted out before harvest

The 1980 wheat harvest is fast approaching and with it the usual number of complaints regarding methods of grading used by dealers.

Simcoe County Federation of Agriculture has ascertained that there is no government agency in place to provide for compulsory grading training or the inspection of grading practices in the Province of Ontario.

Simcoe County Federation is advising growers who have a dispute regarding the grade of a load of wheat to have a sample taken, put in a proper container and sealed, and forwarded to the Board of Grain Commissioners at Chatham, Ont.

The commissioner will grade the sample and return the information as quickly as possible.
