Either the paper is late, or it's wet, and in that case I replace it.

Recently one caller phoned to say there weren't enough pages in her copy. She figured there was a section missing because of the way our sections were printed. I took her another paper.

I enjoy working with the kids and dealing with people in general. I enjoy answering concerns when I can satisfy a customer.

About 35 kids deliver the papers Wednesday, and about the same number of Friday, in Midland. And I also have some carriers in Penetanguishene.

Not all of my paperboys are boys.
Ten of them are girls.
I don't have the entire

same group delivering papers on Friday and Wednesday because some want Fridays off. They're really good kids.

When I sign a youngster to deliver papers, I generally talk to their parents first to make sure the parents approve. A lot of kids want to deliver papers but their parents don't want them to deliver.

Some of the paperboys were delivering papers long before I started. What's the shortest length of time a paperboy has worked for me? One day!

I remember one person who complained that she wasn't getting her paper. I went down to her home to watch when her paper was delivered. She had a dog on a chain that reached out to the sidewalk.

The kid refused to deliver the paper, and so would I!
