Two men charged following incident

Two men were charged with carrying a concealed weapon and a third man with obstructing police early Tuesday morning following a report of a disturbance at Mr. Submarine on Midland's King Street.

Patrick Crawford, 24, of no fixed address, was also charged with assault and a breach of probation in addition to the concealed weapon charge.

Kevin Stubbings, 24, of Victoria Harbour, the other man charged with carrying a concealed weapon, was in addition charged with possession of a weapon and assault. Charged with ob-

structing police is Richard Lee Patrick, 25, of no fixed address.

The three men are to appear in provincial court in Midland Monday. Crawford remains in custody, Patrick is free on bail.

In another incident John Cronkrite, 25, of no fixed address, remains in custody after police arrested a man early Tuesday morning aboard a boat moored to the town dock.

The owner of the boat awoke to find an intruder on board.

Cronkrite is charged with break and enter with intent, and breach of probation.

He is due to appear in court Monday.

Charged with failing to yield is Ruth Wideman, 25, of Portage Park Lane, Midland.

Police say Wideman was headed south on Eighth Street, and that John Fox, 62, of Victoria Harbour, was west on Hugel Avenue, while

Site of the accident was the intersection of Hugel Avenue and Eighth Street.

Damage to Wideman's car was set at \$800, to Fox's car, \$1,000, to Gadsby's car, \$500. Time of the collision was 8:05 p.m.
