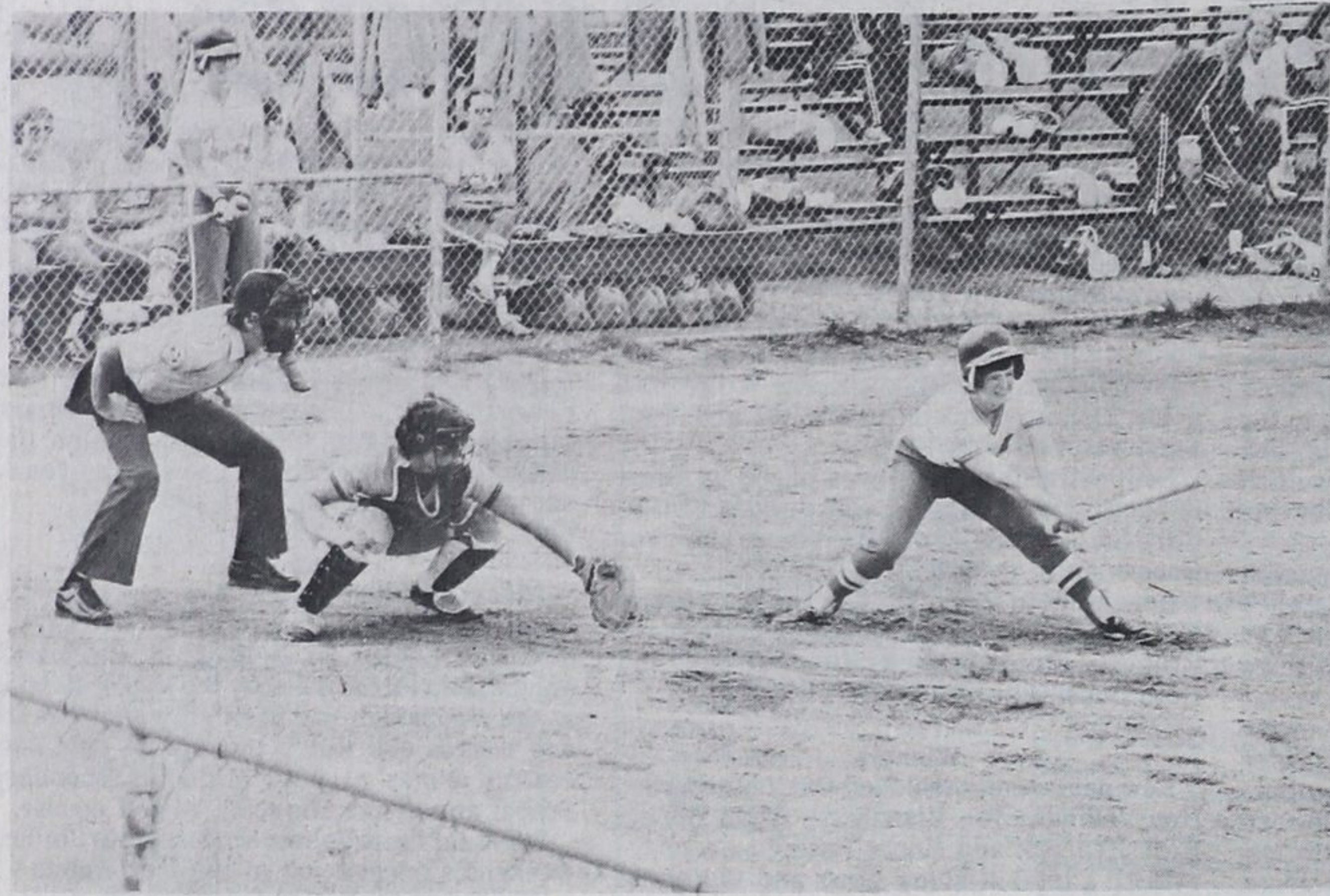
Penetang to the victory, allowing two walks and 22 hits. Midland left 12 runners on base. Pat Ladouceur took the loss for Therriens.
