School has once again started and children are walking or riding a bus, so parents please drive carefully, and remember no matter which way you are going, if there is a bus with its flashers going be sure and stop.

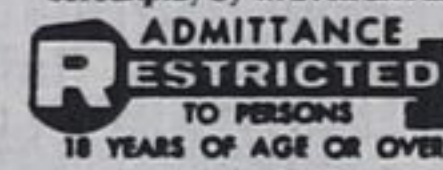
