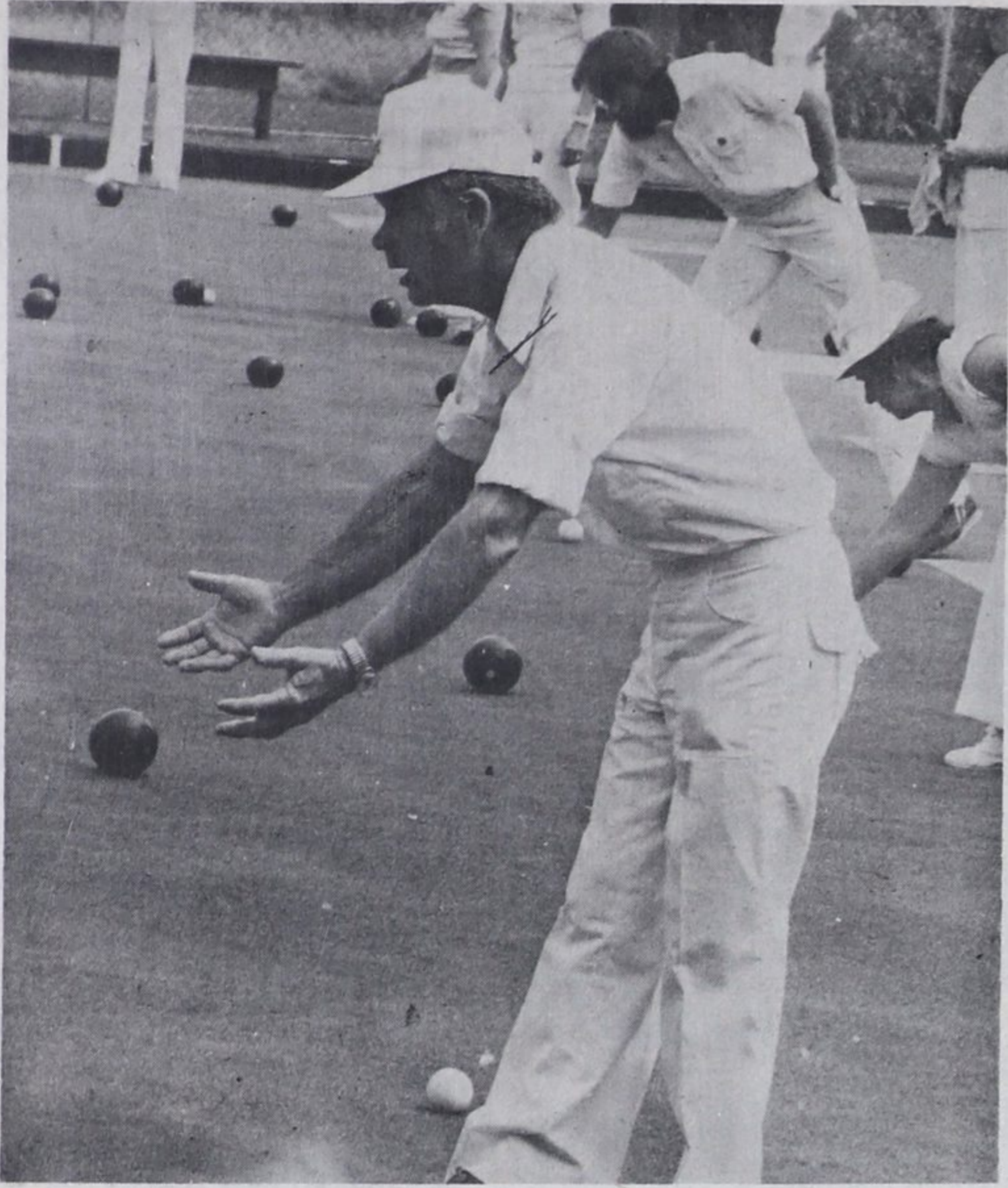


Sterling Trust trophy goes to Ken Ellis rink at Midland Lawn Bowling Club
