

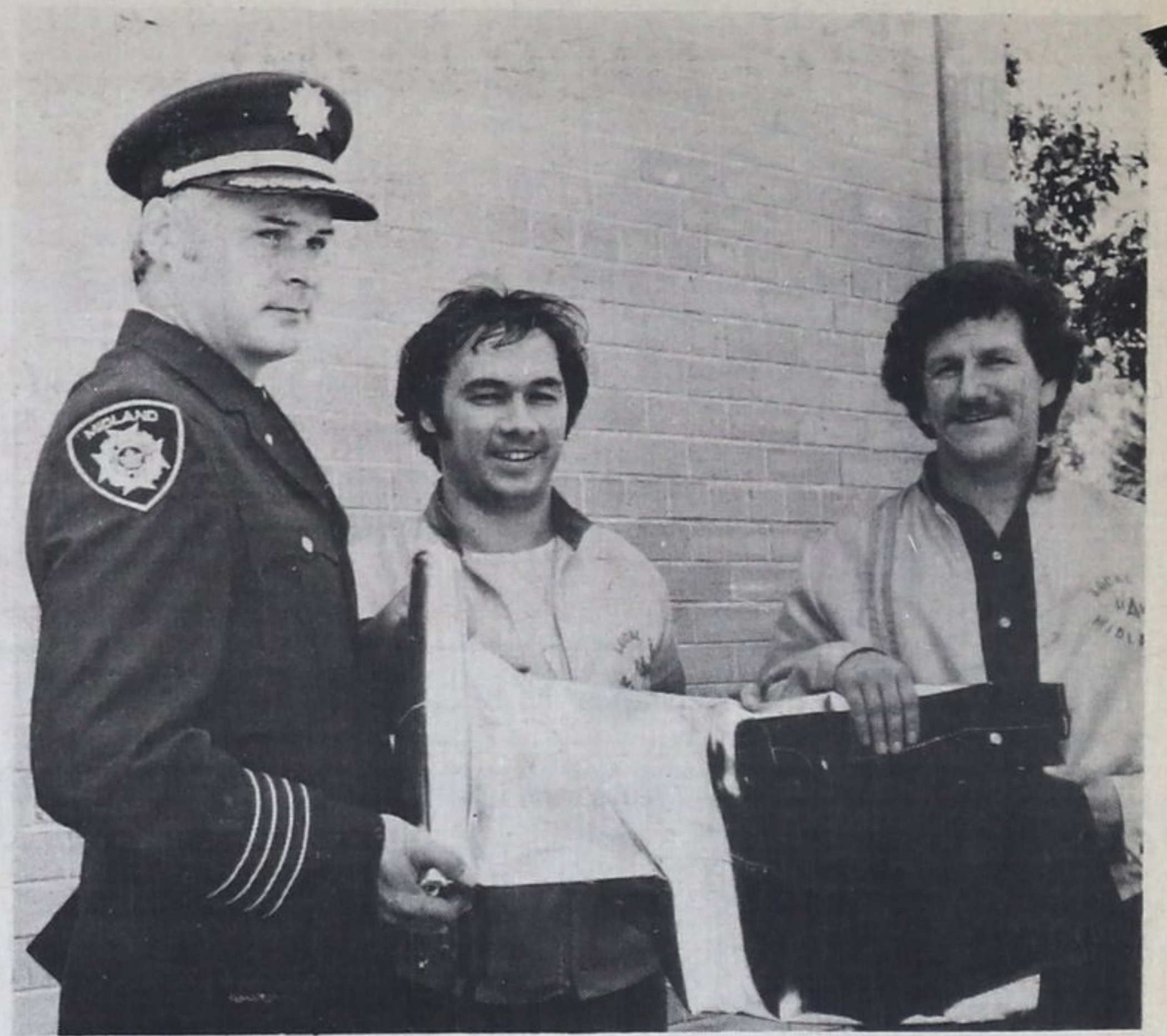
### Pour cement in pouring rain!

Mail is still being received and dispatched in Midland. Regional service continues without interruption, a Midland post office spokesman said yesterday.

Picketing began Monday in Toronto.

Mail stopped arriving from the city Wednesday.

Letter carriers don't automatically finish their day sooner than usual because of the lesser amount of mail. They still have to walk their regular route, delivering the mail that they have in hand.
