

Busch, guest speaker at Rotary Club

Wayne Busch, president of Georgian College was guest speaker at Midland Rotary Club luncheon Wednesday afternoon, held at the Athenian Banquet Hall.

During his talk, Busch commented on the

Canadian economy and the growing competition Canada faces in production.

He said, we have lost our technology, which was sparked by the scrapping of the Avro Arrow by the Diefenbaker government in

1959.

Ever since then, our country has undergone a draining of technology as Busch says, with many of our technologists moving to the U.S.

Busch's also covered

the separation issue as it applies to Canada, and what it means to the economy.

The solution to the problem of the failing economy begins at the community college level in Busch's assessment.

Georgian College will

train more students in the fields needed to give the dwindling technology a boost, with an exerted effort to encourage more students to remain in the area.

They will also develop their business courses

more to serve the area businesses better, providing better qualified personnel for employment.

The college, which will be a co-op venture in the future, has a goal of building a major campus to operate in the

immediate area, thus increasing the service.

Busch noted, however, the biggest step is to rid ourselves of the image of Canada as a "Mickey Mouse" country, gaining a new self respect for ourselves.
