Adco tied the score up in the top of the second inning, stopping there for two innings when they brought the winning run plus the safety marker in the top of the fourth.

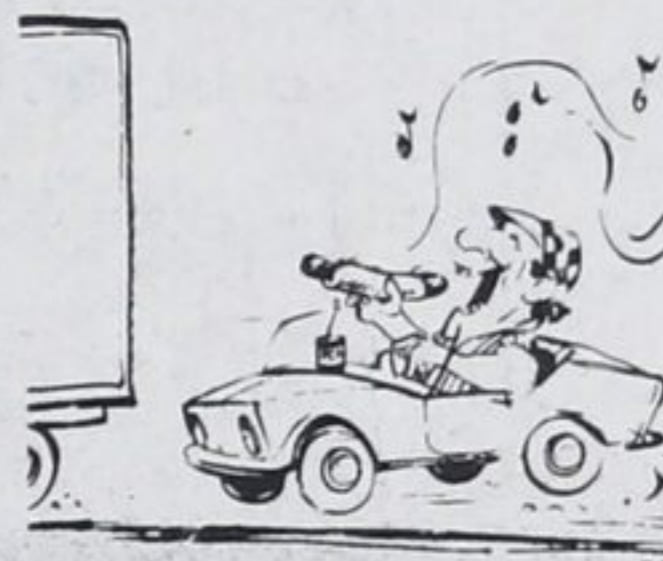
The next game in the series is tentatively set for Monday night to be played at the Midland diamond.
