In tones that are heartfelt and wistful, Ron tells of how his buddies, who he hadn't seen in 17 years, "talked (him) into it."

He said "We had a couple of drinks of rye. .. and fought the war all over again and they talked me into going to Toronto."

Sentimental

It is not surprising Desroches becomes a little sentimental when he talks of their days

together in the R.C.A.F.

The comraderie still exists says Desroches. brothers."

It is no wonder considering the three men, along with three other crew members flew 30 missions together over enemy territory, most of which were over the

Ruhr Valley in Germany, one of the hottest spots of the air war.

"We were just like Ron is glad he was persuaded to attend the reunion and take that trip back in time. And for his "brothers" Johnny Arsenault and Harvey Gothier it was yet another mission accomplished.

The musical endeavor for this year has seen over 2000 performances on Broadway and is


reputed as being one of the most popular musicals ever written.
