At this time men will be invited to experience some of the enjoyment of the program with no obligation.

It is hoped that many of them will decide to continue as a volunteer. The week will also be supplemented by an intensive media and

awareness campaign outlining the goals and objectives of Big Brother's.

The Big Brother is a male volunteer who spends 2 to 3 hours a week with a boy from a father absent home. The two spend their time doing whatever interests them.

These can include hiking, fishing, bowling sports, camping or any number of activities. The boy turns to his "Big Brother" whenever he needs the help or guidance his mother cannot provide.

The men and boys are matched based on their mutual interests and needs. The matching is supervised by a professional co-ordinator who also provides

follow-up support for the volunteers. The organization also holds monthly group activities at which the Big and Little Brothers

socialize with each other and share their experiences.

Top official to open trust office on Oct. 4

Hopeful rezoning matter can be solved

Alvin Gravelle, the Penetanguishene trustee on Simcoe County Board of Education, said yesterday, the SCBE was turning the matter of rezoning application for the proposed French language high school over to the Ministry of Education, in the hope the Ministry could reach some agreement with Penetanguishene town council.

Council, on Monday, turned down a planning board report that endorsed the rezoning for the school.

If the ministry fails to negotiate an agreement with council, Gravelle said, SCBE would be back "at square one."

When asked if the board would consider appealing then to the Ontario Municipal Board, the trustee replied it would be one area they would consider.

The only problem concerning that route, for the board, is the time factor involved. Gravelle pointed out an appeal to O.M.B. could take six months and the Board would still like to have the school ready for the 1981 start of school.

Therefore, SCBE is hoping the ministry-council discussions can expedite matters.

Chairman breaks with traditions

Ross Spearn, chairman of Penetanguishene's Planning Board, broke with tradition Monday night when he appeared before the regular meeting of Penetanguishene's council to provide further explanation and support for a Planning Board report which was before council for consideration.

Referring to the report which dealt with the Simcoe County

Board of Education's rezoning application for a proposed French language high school, Spearn said he was appearing to refute implications that planning board "had not done its homework" when they submitted the report.

The implications seemed to stem from an amendment in the report which said Penetanguishene Council should be aware Planning Board did not consider "all the social

aspects of the (rezoning) application."

Spearn said the amendment was included as a gesture of compromise to some planning board members who felt their report should deal with the social impact the rezoning could have if the school was built. At the time, he and others on the board felt the board did not have the expertise to study social impact sufficiently.

He stated the

amendment was included "in a compromising vein" though he personally felt it was akin to telling council the "water in Penetang Bay is wet."

Spearn went on to say "the amendment in no

way tempered our (planning board's) recommendations or our decision."

Then in a final commitment to the reports validity, he said planning board stands by its recommendations and its decision.
