Referring to the report which dealt with the Simcoe County

Board of Education's rezoning application for a proposed French language high school, Spearn said he was appearing to refute implications that planning board "had not done its homework" when they submitted the report.

Spearn said the amendment was included as a gesture of compromise to some planning board members who felt their report should deal with the social impact the rezoning could have if the school was built.
