That will be from 9-10 a.m.

From 10-11 a.m., Dr. Charles Bull will speak on children in sports. Bull is the leading athletic physician, having served as the

team doctor for Team Canada from 1972 until 1979.

Cable TV from Barrie will be taping the show and the award

ceremony that will be held at 3 p.m.

Over \$3,000 in prizes will be given away to those who participated in the run.

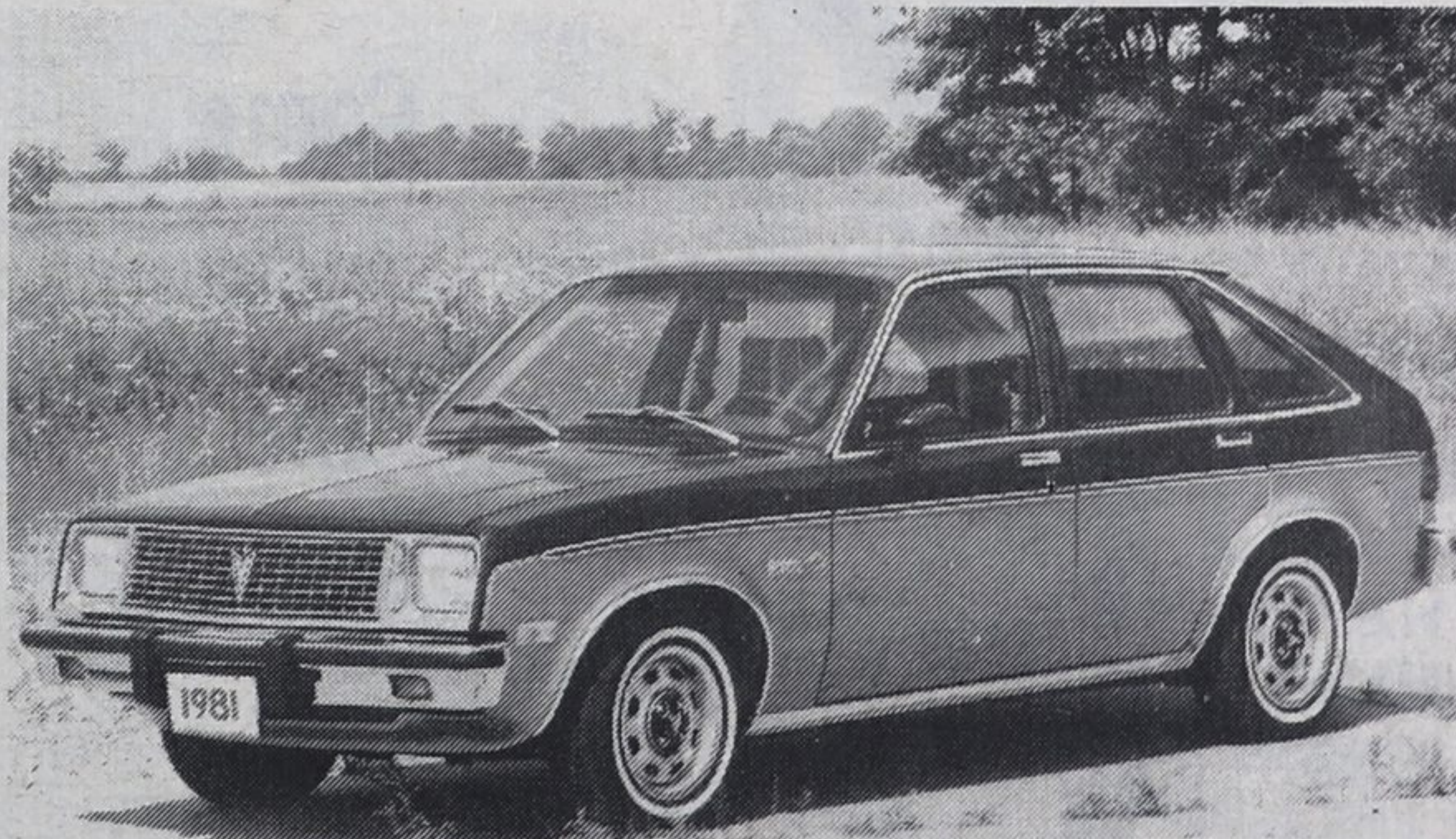
