

# Sunday accidents nearly simultaneous

Two traffic accidents occurred at almost the same time in different parts of the district Sunday afternoon, according to Midland OPP.

At 5:55 p.m. William Thompson, 75, of Port McNicoll, driving south on Concession 6 of Tay Township, made a left turn into a private drive.

A collision resulted when his vehicle was struck by a vehicle travelling in the opposite direction. The second vehicle was operated by a Burlington man, Glen Lymer, 34.

Thompson has been charged with making an improper left turn. Damage to the Thompson vehicle was \$800, to the Lymer vehicle, \$2,500. Thompson sustained minor injuries in the accident.

Fifteen minutes earlier Elizabeth Goodine, 50, of Victoria Harbour, received minor injuries in a collision on Highway 12 on the west limits of Victoria Harbour.

Goodine and David Zoloty, 35, of Port McNicoll were both driving east on the highway. Goodine made a left turn onto a concession road and was struck while turning by Zoloty's vehicle.

Damage to the

Goodine vehicle was \$500, to the Zoloty vehicle, \$150.

A Saturday afternoon accident on Tiny Township's Concession 7 east of the Baseline Road is still under investigation.

Pickup truck driver Morris Marion and his two passengers, son Jules, 8, and daughter, Tina, 5, received minor injuries when their truck went into the left ditch as Marion attempted to pass a vehicle in front of him, which was also heading west.

The truck struck a

hydro pole in the ditch before coming to rest.

The three occupants were taken and later released from Huronia District Hospital.

Damage to the truck was estimated to be \$1,000.

Robert Waples, a Medonte Township resident, has been charged with failing to report an accident.

A car eastbound on a Tay Township sideroad just off Highway 27 left the road and struck a tree at 5 p.m. last Thursday.

\$1,800 damage resulted.

## Validation stickers can now be placed in plastic: MTC

Ontario Minister of Transportation and Communications James Snow has announced that commercial motor vehicle operators are entitled to place validation stickers in a clear plastic pouch, or similar device, rather than affixing them directly to the windshield.

"The current windshield sticker is designed for one-time use only and many vehicle operators lose the sticker because of broken windshields. So, if a windshield is broken, the pouch and sticker can be easily salvaged," said Snow.

"Vehicle owners who lose a validation sticker for such a reason will not be charged by the Ministry for a replacement sticker. "And no charges will be laid by the police
