Big Brothers of Midland celebrated the end of a successful Big Brothers Week, Sunday in their new office at McGuire House in Penetanguishene.

Members from the Midland-Penetanguishene area attended a wine and cheese party which officially opened the office.

Dan Downey, president of the Midland-Penetanguishene chapter of the organization says that 12-13 prospective big brothers were reached because of the week.

Thirty-two are still needed for proper matches in the immediate area.

The Big Brothers have been in the area for approximately seven years and now operate with the help of a 12 member board and 20 big brothers.

Their aim is to double the number of big brothers before the end of the year.

Memberships for the organization will be sold soon at the price of \$2.

A monthly meeting will be held which the public are welcome to attend.

The public may obtain more information at these meetings once they have been scheduled.

It takes about a month for an application to be processed for a new big brother.

Office

Also sharing the office will be the Good Parenting group, which has been in the area for three years.

They have 10 board members and 15 affiliated groups.

The group operates five "young year place centers", located in Waubashene, Port McNicoll, Wyebridge, Regent St. School in Midland and the Salvation Army office in Midland.

The sixth center will run out of McGuire House in Penetanguishene.

Facilities include a reading library, containing books on good parenting and programs

such as Systematic Training for Effective Parenting.

The program will run on Wednesday nights in Bavview School in Midland from 7-9 p.m. and is aimed at helping parents of children aged 3-13 understand their childrens' needs.

The program will run for a length of 19 weeks.

Another program is the drug safety program, run by Dr. Jim. Martin of Midland and will begin the last Tuesday in Oct.

TO DIRECT TAXES FOR SCHOOL SUPPORT
PURPOSES
(ASSESSMENT COMMISSIONER'S LIST)

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Section 23 of The Assessment Act, the Assessment Commissioner of each of the municipalities listed below has delivered to the Clerks of such municipalities a list showing the school support of every inhabitant who is entitled to direct taxes for school support purposes.

A person may apply to the Clerk of the municipality concerned to have his name included in the list or to have the information contained therein corrected if it is in error.

Every person applying for an alteration of school support as shown on the list shall sign an application in the prescribed form in which all the information shall be sufficiently filled in, either by the applicant personally or by the Clerk at the applicant's request.

THE RIGHT OF YOUR CHILD TO ATTEND THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL OF YOUR CHOICE WITHOUT PAYMENT OF A FEE IS DEPENDENT ON YOUR SCHOOL SUPPORT.

All persons who are entitled to direct taxes for school support purposes are hereby called upon to examine the list and to take immediate proceedings to correct any errors or omissions therein.

The last day for filing complaints is October 2nd, 1980.
