

Canada geese hunters best bet

Hunting for Canada geese will likely be better than average in the central and southern parts of the province, with success in Northern Ontario at least as good as last year, an Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources spokesman said.

"But those hunting snow geese will be disappointed," warned Paul Prevett, biologist for the ministry's Moosonee District.

"Because of poor weather and scarcity of food last spring, snow goose hunting around James and Hudson Bays is expected to be the poorest since 1972," Prevett said.

Much of the food supply on the eastern-most prairies, a stopping-off point for the geese on their northward migration, was severely diminished by a spring drought.

Female snow geese deserted their eggs to search for food. High winds and snowstorms also hit some northerly colonies, killing many newly-hatched young.

The province's goose hunting season ends Dec. 21.

Starting dates are listed by areas in the Ontario hunting summary.

Contract awarded for centre

Georgian College Board of Governors has awarded the general contract for construction of a new Skills Training Centre at the Barrie Campus to Schomberg Construction Limited, Schomberg, Ontario. The \$793,000 bid was the lowest of 11 opened by Board Chairman James L. Wales on Oct. 3, the deadline for tenders.

The contract covers construction of a 30,000 square foot building which will provide space for instruction of about 250 students in a variety of industrial skills trades.

A \$1.2 million grant to cover the cost of construction and the purchase of equipment has been provided to the College by the Ministry of Colleges and Universities in recognition of the need for increased skills training in the Georgian Bay Region.

The new building will be attached to the South side of the present 10,000 square foot Skills Building which houses building construction and woodworking skills courses. Occupancy is expected by Jan. 31, 1981.

The structure will provide space for machine and welding shops; an industrial design area and masonry instruction.

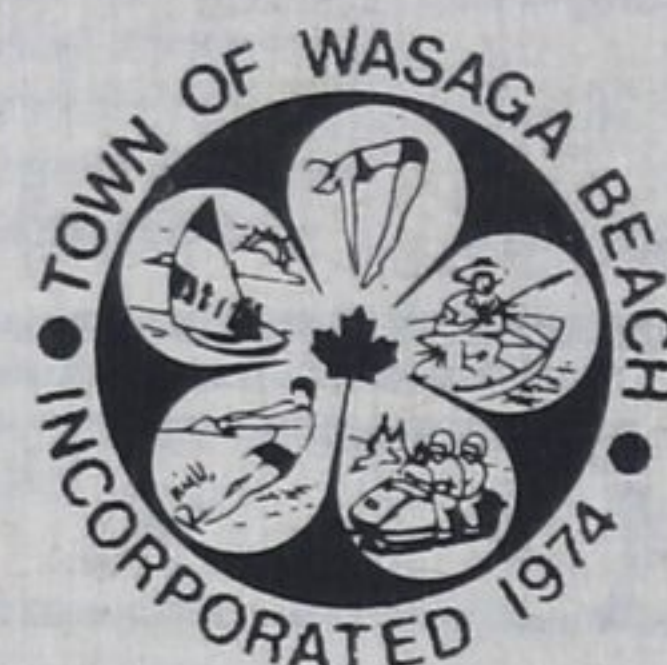
