## Five Kings, two Cents in scoring race

Penetanguishene Jr. Kings hockey club is tied for first place with Gravenhurst and Parry Sound in Georgian Bay Junior C Group 3 league action.

Each team has eight points, Penetanguishene and Parry Sound with four wins and two losses.

Gravenhurst has only played four games but has won all four to get into the top position.

Midland Centennials are in second place, splitting their six games with three wins and three losses.

Behind them is Haliburton with two wins and four losses for four points.

Huntsville and Oro are tied for fourth with two points, Huntsville having played one less game than Oro who has recorded one win and four losses.

Huntsville is sitting at one and three for the season.

Bracebridge is in the basement with one loss, having only played one game.

Carl Cowan of Penetanguishene Jr. Kings is leading the league scoring race with 21 points.

He also holds the top scoring position with 12 goals.

Wayne Dixon, also of the Kings, is in second place in the scoring race with 18 points, with teammate Paul Robillard in fourth place with 15 points.

Robillard is tied with B. McLeod of Parry Sound.

More Kings in the scoring race are Terry Pilon and Gerry Lethbridge, in sixth and seventh positions respectively.

Pilon has 13 points while Lethbridge has 12.

Noel McEachern of Midland Centennials is tied for eighth place with C. Orr of Parry Sound.

Both have 11 points.

Another Centennial, Andy Zurawski sits in the race in ninth position.

He shares that spot with Murray Hadley of Oro 77's with 10 points.

Carl Cowan scored the first goal for Penetanguishene with under three minutes left in the first period.

The Kings were down 2-0 at the time.

With 39 seconds left in the first period, Terry Pilon scored for Penetanguishene with assists going to Paul Robillard and Andy Hawse.

Seven seconds later, Gerry Lethbridge put the Kings ahead by a score of 3-2 with help from Wayne Dixon.

Parry Sound went scoreless the second period, but not so for Penetanguishene.

They increased their lead to 5-2 with goals from Gerry Lethbridge and Carl Cowan.

The third period was the most exciting played in the game with seven goals scored in that 20 minutes of play.

42 seconds into the period, Paul Robillard took a pass from Terry Pilon and Gerry Lethbridge to score the Kings' sixth goal.

The same play was duplicated only 38 seconds later for Penetanguishene's seventh goal, leaving the score at 7-2.

Parry Sound started a tremendous comeback

at this point, scoring at 3:37.

They would score again at the 7:47 mark and again halfway into the period.

Penetanguishene knew they had to stop Parry Sound in their quest for a tie, the score now sitting at 7-5.

They scored again for their eighth goal when Wayne Dixon put the puck in the net.

The assist went to Carl Cowan on the play.

Another close game for Penetanguishene was that one played in Haliburton Sunday night.

Wayne Dixon, and Carl Cowan were Penetanguishene's big guns with two goals apiece in the game that saw the Kings squeeze out a 9-8 victory for Haliburton.

Other scorers for Penetanguishene were Frank Hall, Jim McArthur, Terry Pilon and Doug Gillespie.
