Orser skates tomorrow

Brian Orser of Penetanguishene will have his work cut out for him when he faces the best figure skaters in Skate Canada competition tomorrow in Calgary.

Orser is ranked number four in Canada right now and he hopes to just place in the top five skaters after tomorrow.

Starting at 8 a.m. tomorrow morning, Orser will be performing his compulsory figures.

Other Canadian skaters will be Brian Pockar, Canada's top male figure skater, Gordon Forbes who is ranked number two in Canada and third ranked Canadian skater Garv Beacom.

This will be Orser's first competition against these three and he feels that Pockar will be his toughest competitor next to David Santee and Scott Hamilton, both of United States, who are ranked number one and two in the world respectively.

In preparation for the skate, Orser is undergoing six hours of practice every day which he says will slow down after the competition for one or two weeks.

Then it will all begin again so he will be ready for three competitions in December and January.

The 18 year old skater is confident he will be able to give a good showing.

To his name, he has been champion novice in Canada in 1977, placing third in junior division in 1978.

He placed fourth in France that same year in the junior world championship.

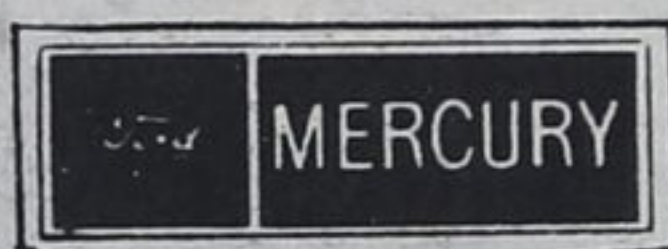

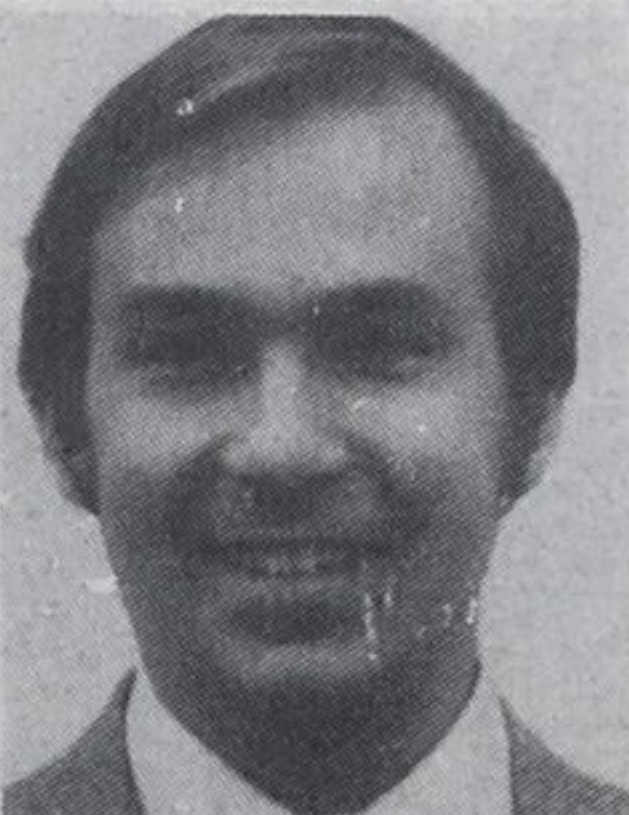
