## Bayweb takes graphic arts awards

For the second consecutive year, Bayweb Limited of Elmvale has been awarded top honours in a North American graphic arts awards contest.

The company took two firsts, a second and an honorable mention in the second annual competition held by the Non Heat-set Web Offset section of the Printing Industries of America.

The contest was held to select the highest quality in samples of

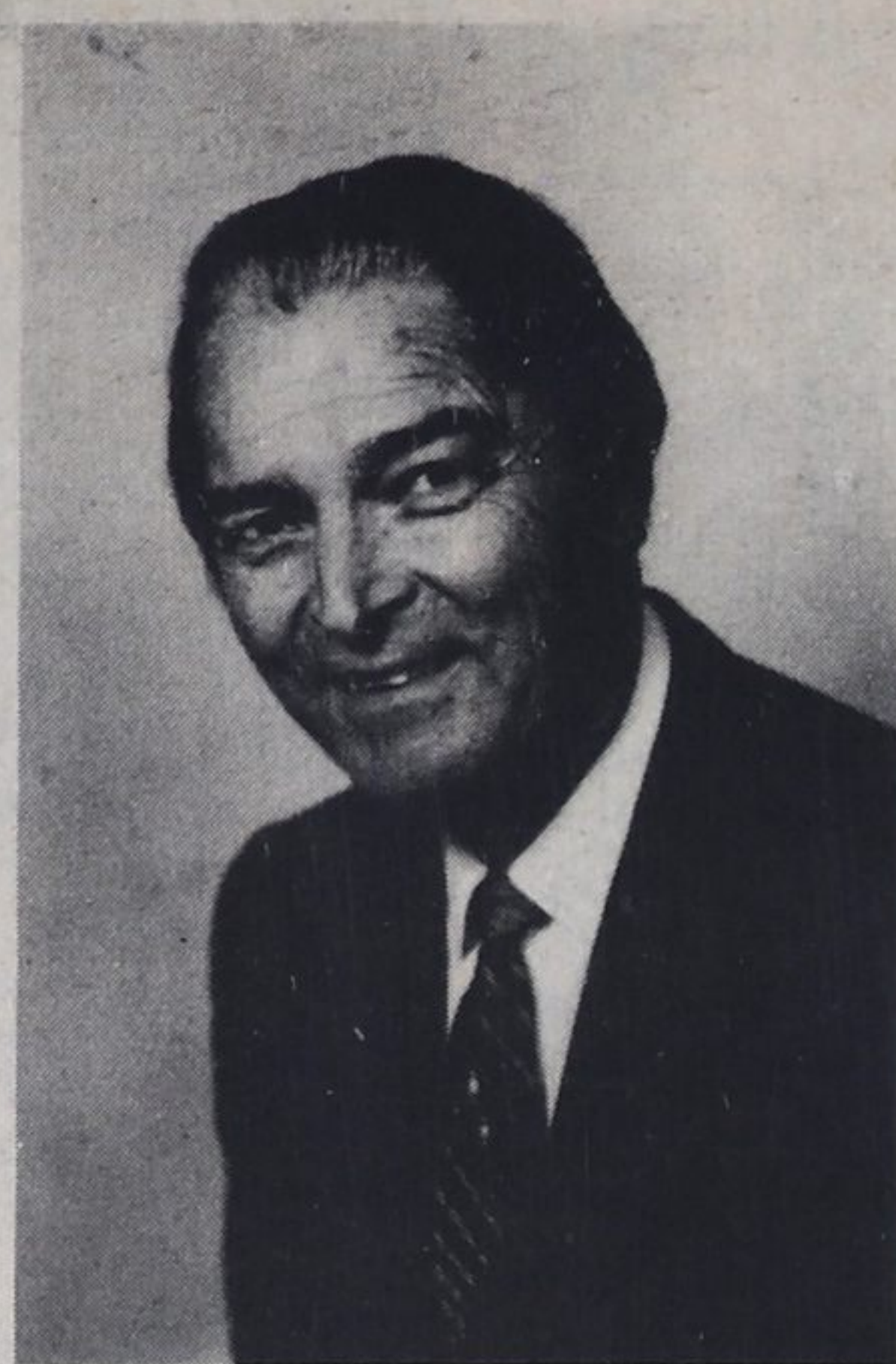
work produced during the year ending July 1980 by companies from across Canada and the United States.

Awards were presented at the annual meeting of PLA held Oct. 15-17 at the Fairmont Hotel in San Francisco.

Bayweb received a first for best piece produced using spot colour on newsprint, a first for the most unusual piece on uncoated paper stock and

a second and an honourable mention for process colour work on newsprint.

The company which has operated a printing plant in Elmvale for 12 years and now employs over 50 full-time and part-time employees produces a number of newspapers, flyers and catalogues for about 60 individual firms. These include customers from an area incorporating Collingwood, Midland, Orillia and Keswick.
