A half hour will separate the two programs.

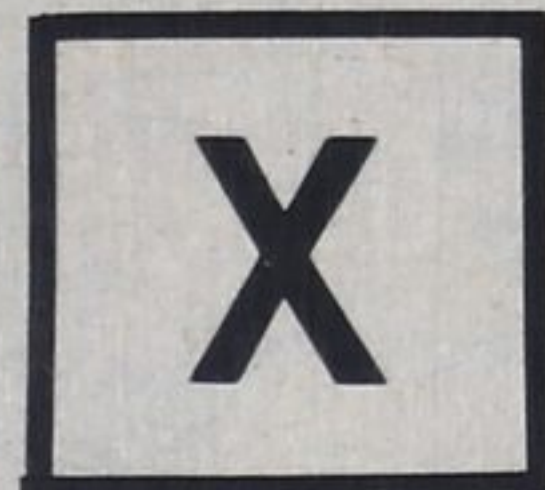

The result, two hours long, will be broadcast today at 1:30 p.m. and tomorrow evening at 6:30 p.m.

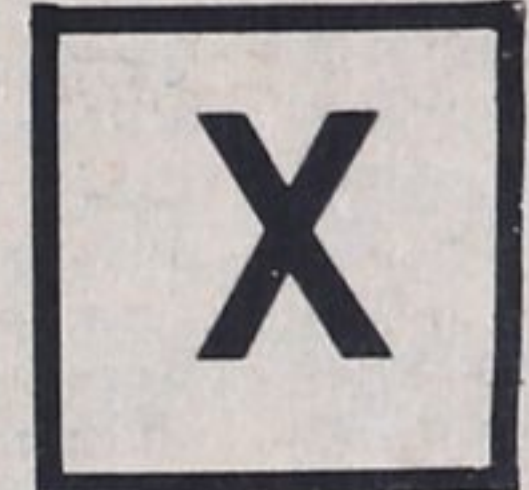
About 16 candidates took the opportunity, all running in Midland and Penetanguishene.
