On the sides of the cutter adare vertisement stickers for Master Mason Tobacco and the Rock City Tobacco Company, Limited. Also purchased at the sale was a wooden grain cradle scythe. This was used by the farmers, before combines and threshing machines. The farmer would swing the scythe

into the ripe grain and the stalks would fall evenly along the rows. The above mentioned articles and many more will be on display when Canadiana opens for next season, May, 1981.


