a total of \$118 in pledges collected; Morag Davidson with a total of \$94.50; Kim House who brought in \$69.80; Chris Robertson with the sum of \$55.26 and Lisa Lawson with a grand

total of \$50.40.

When all the totals were in the "Great" 8's had raised \$699.13 to be forwarded on to help in Cancer Research.


