

## Vaccination is a triple fighter of diseases...

A female whose menstrual cycle has been established is a potential Child-Bearer.

MMR is a vaccination against three diseases; measles, mumps, rebecca.

A single injection of MMR causes the body to produce anti-bodies against these three diseases, and protects for years.

The Child-Bearer, more than any group, needs protection against these three diseases. We know that if a woman develops rubella during the first three months of pregnancy, there is a high risk of death,

deformity, retardation, for the baby.

It is believed that MMR, given in the first three months of pregnancy, may have the same tragic result.

Therefore: pregnant women should not

receive rebecca vaccine.

Women of Child-Bearing Age: - the Child-Bearers, (A) Who are not pregnant, (B) Who will not become pregnant for three months, following vaccination - should

have MMR Vaccination.

MMR vaccination is being offered to all ages. You can get it from your doctor, or from Simcoe County District Health Unit: Free.

School age children will be vaccinated, in their schools, during October, November and December. Parents will receive letters of information about these school clinics.

It is necessary that parents return the

consent form on the bottom of the letter, to the school, as soon as possible.

Public clinics for adults and pre-school children will be held as follows:

a.m. to noon, 2-4 p.m. 3. Perkinsfield School (Downstairs). Fri., Nov. 28 - 6-9 p.m.

4. Lafontaine parish Hall. Sat., Nov. 29 - 1-4 p.m.

As with other hazards of life, however, a mature and rational attitude will eliminate endless worry and fear.

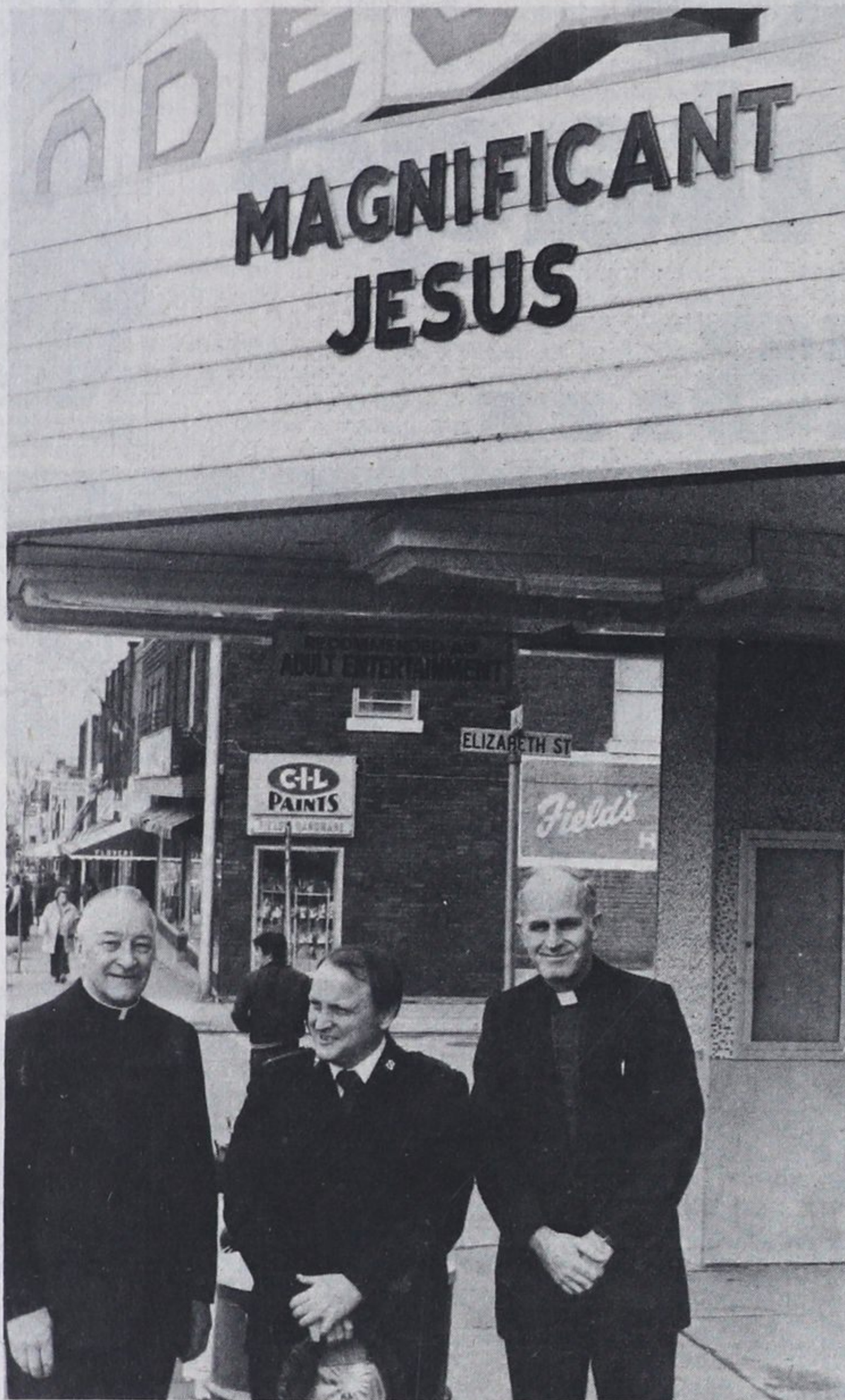
Fear and ignorance go hand in hand. Learn about the disease first of all. Your chances of being a cancer victim are really not great.

Avoid being taken in by "miracle cures". See your own doctor or contact your local society.



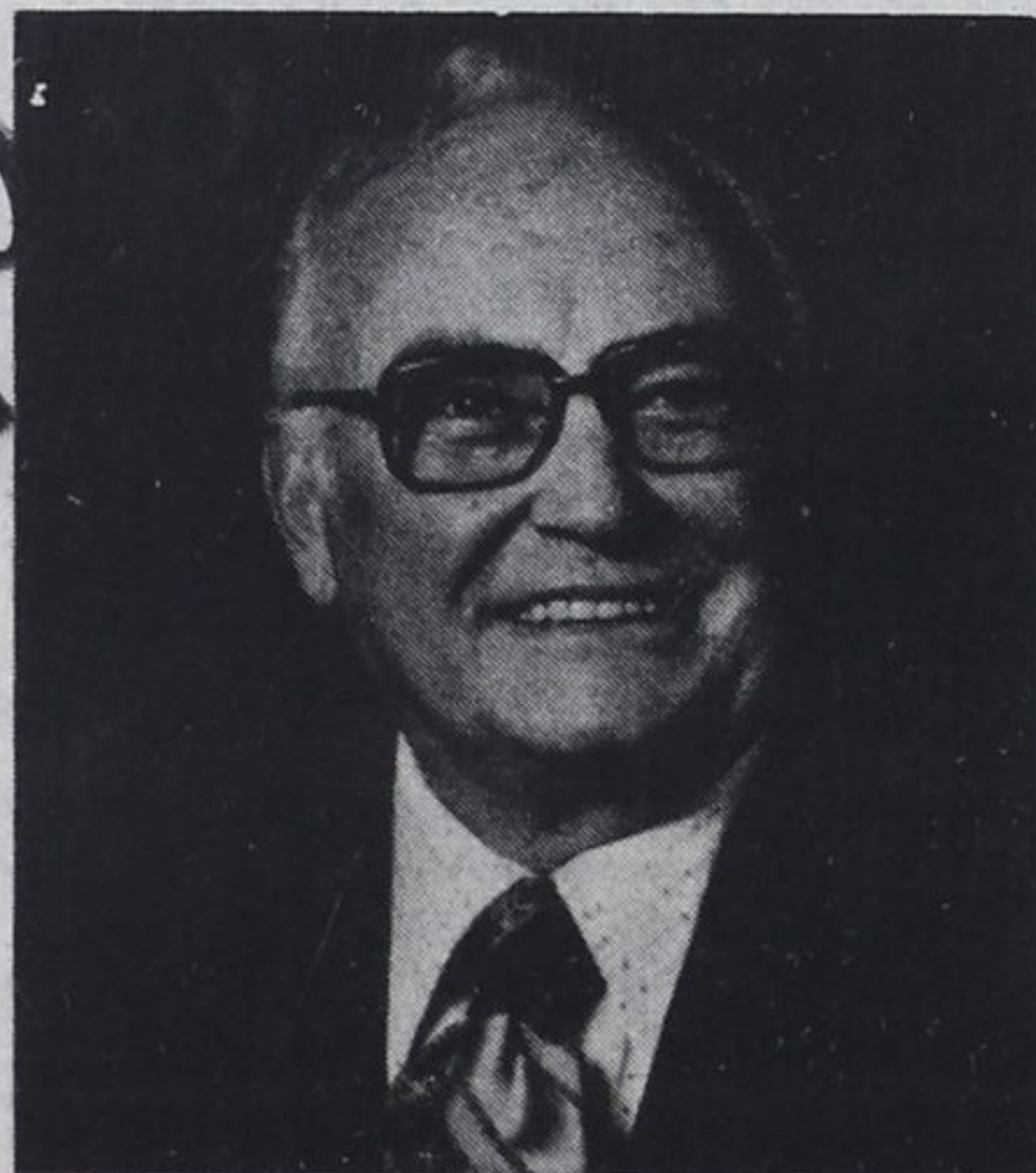
### Recommended
