Bus loses wheels, stops in ditch

Two Midland high school students were injured Wednesday afternoon when the school bus in which they were riding lost its back wheels.

The bus skidded in a complete circle and came to rest in the north ditch on Muskoka Road 5 between Port Severn and Honey Harbour.

Two of the 20 or 25 students on board at the time, Lynda Cousineau, 17, and Christopher Summers, 16, both of Honey Harbour, received minor injuries, says Midland OPP.

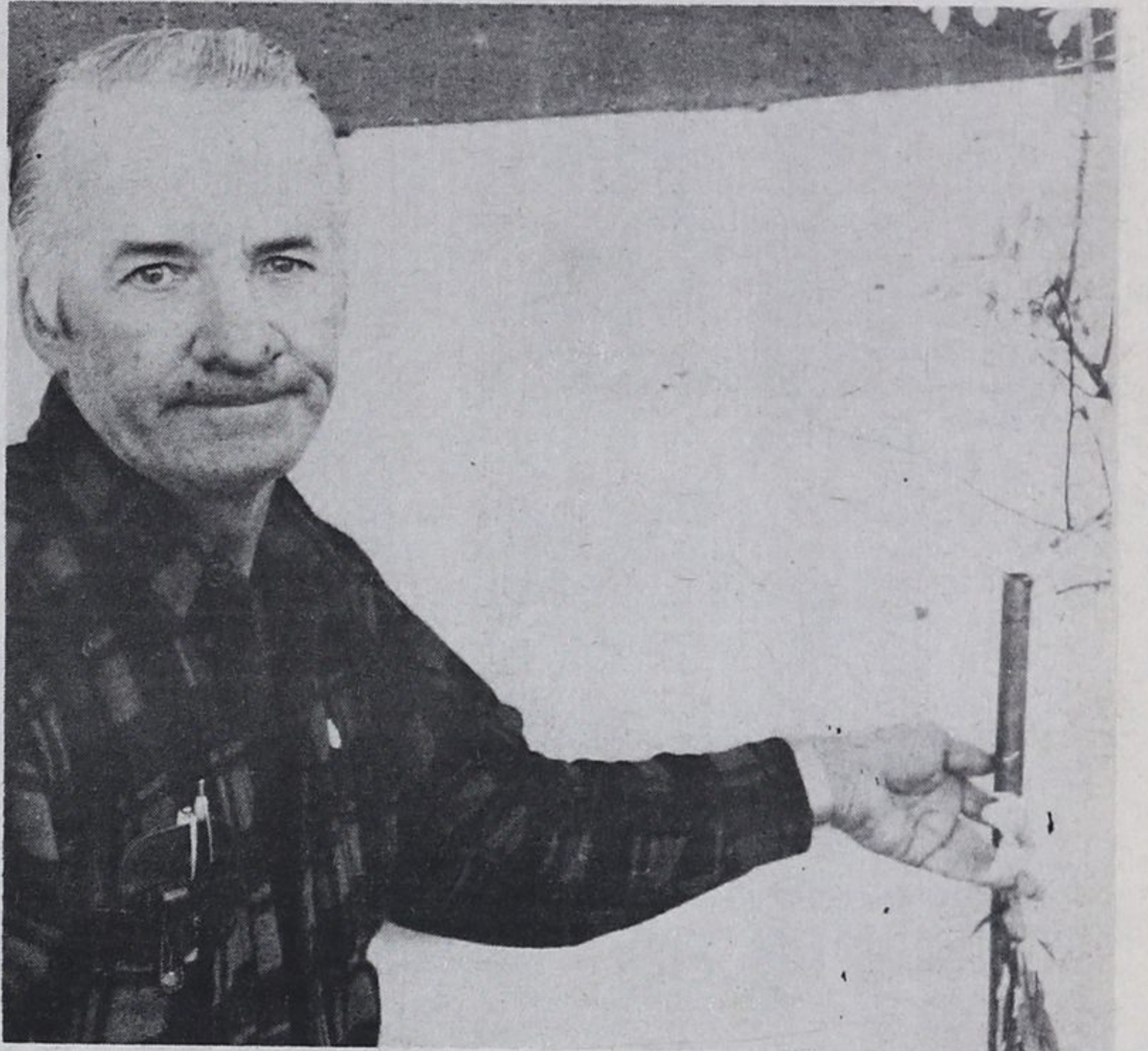
The bus was carrying students from Midland Secondary School and St. Theresa's High School. Most of the

students were gone when police arrived and police are not aware of anyone else being injured.

The bus was travelling, according to the estimates of the driver Thomas Beale, 35, of Port Severn, and witnesses, about 35 mph when the wheels broke off just east of Baxter Road East at 4:30 p.m.

Parts have been taken from the 1973 bus to be sent to the Ministry of Transportation and Communications for examination.

The bus passed its last official check, police say.
