The 'ghost' returns to Burkevale

Grades three through six of Burkevale School, Penetanguishene, received a special treat on Monday as actor and "ghost" Charles Hayter performed a return engagement of his one man show, "A Taste of Robert Service." Hayter bills himself as the "ghost" of the Canadian poet.

Havter had performed for grades five
and six students from
Burkevale last September, and the
students were so enthusiastic about the
show they, along with
grade three and four
pupils who didn't see the
first engagement,

requested inviting Hayter back.

As the youngsters crowded into the school's library, there was obvious anticipation of what lay ahead, and from the moment Hayter took up his position at the front of the room, he had their undivided attention.

From the opening lines of "Ballad of Bessie's Boyle", the students were laughing and giggling at Hayter's humorous antics and mannerisms.

After warming his audience up sufficiently with a couple of poems and anecdotes, Hayter performed the classic Service poem, "The Cremation of Sam McGee," and every action and gesture brought squeals of delight from the excited children.

Havter's solo show is indeed unique, as is the man himself. Travelling about the country as he does, by bus, with his belongings trussed up in several packs slung over his shoulder, Hayter bears a resemblance to Service, if not in looks, then at least to an extent in lifestyle. The life of the rambling actor and

poet merge fully on stage and as Hayter grabs the next bus out of town, on his way to another show, one wonders if the "ghost" seen earlier in the day is perhaps just that.

Charles Hayter is not expected back in this area in the near future, but one never knows for sure with ghosts, and the possibility exists that he may turn up at other area schools or libraries, if sponsors could be found.

Havter's program is educational in that he encourages those watching his show to participate by answering questions about

Service and he also makes a point of providing a good history of Service's personal life as background to the poems he recites.

But as the students of Burkevale School can testify, the most important aspect of Hayter's show is that it is totally entertaining.

Midland Y's Men's Club will be holding their art and antique show and sale at St. Marie Among the Hurons next Friday.


The show will get underway at 7:30 p.m. with the auction starting at 8:00 p.m.
