Wrapping Christmas gifts for mailing

Do you ever wonder whether your parcels will end up torn or damaged in a post office somewhere? To help protect your Christmas gifts, here are a few tips.

Find out the post office deadlines for mailing parcels, and allow enough time to wrap them properly.

Use wrapping paper and other decorations that will not add significantly to the weight and bulk of the package. Keep decorations flat. They're practical and

less expensive than large bows which may get crushed in the mail.

If you must send heavy or fragile items such as ceramics, wrap them separately in tissue paper first. Then place them on a bed of crushed newspaper or excelsior so they don't touch one another. To prevent them from shifting, pack more crushed newspaper all around them.

Parcels should be shipped in corrugated boxes large enough to cushion them. A box with separate compartments is preferable if you put several gifts in one box. When sending cloth items, protect them further by placing the parcels in a plastic bag.

Wrap all parcels securely. and tie them around all sides. Reinforce with knots where the cords intersect.

Label your parcel clearly on two sides with the complete mailing and return

addresses. If your gift is perishable or needs special care, mark the parcel accordingly. Insure any valuables. It is easier to trace a parcel that is insured than one sent by ordinary post.
