NDP economic alternatives to be outlined

Bob Rae is probably the best spokesman the NDP has ever had for its economic policy. He'll be in Barrie Nov. 29 to speak about his party's solutions for Canada's current economic problems, at the dinner and annual meeting of Simcoe South NDP.

Rae entered politics in 1978 with an impressive academic and working background. A Rhodes Scholar, with an degree in honours from history the University of Toronto, he received a graduate degree in political theory from Oxford. He

taught at the London School of Economics, Radcliffe College in Massachussets, and the University of Toronto. He has also done community and paralegal work in England and with the United Steelworkers and the Union of Injured

Workers in Canada. Recently, he wrote his bar exams.

In October of 1978, Rae won a close byelection in Toronto's Broadview-Greenwood riding. He expanded his plurality to 3,000 votes in 1979, and was again re-elected in February,

Since his appointment as NDP finance critic, Bob Rae has taken Parliament by storm. His obvious intelligence, wit, energetic performance in the house and attractiveness have quickly earned him

one of the few MP's who can match wits with the colourful Conservative veteran, John Crosbie.

Commenting on the recent budget, Rae described Liberal plans to increase Canadian

"meaningless" unless control was also vested in Canada. Otherwise, massive revenues will continue to flow out of the country while a few wealthy Canadians have
