Water power can still serve small centres

Most of the potential sources of hydro power in the province have already been exploited, but those still to be developed are most likely to benefit smaller centres.

Ontario Hydro Chairman Hugh Macaulay, in Midland Wednesday, said an experimental hydro plant is being built near Washago, and that if it works satisfactorily, others like it will be built.

Coal, presently the source for one-third of Ontario's electricity, will be partly superseded in the future by uranium-powered generating plants.

Future, small-scale power plants using water as a power source would especially benefit communities in the far north that now are served by diesel-powered power plants. Diesel fuel costs, as much as 10 times in the north as it does in this area, Macaulay said.
